MR. FIELD'S OWN STORY.

How the Cable Lost at Sea was Recovered in Mid-Ocean.

At a dinner given to Mr. Field by the New York Chamber of Commerce, Nov. 5, 1866, he told about the recovery of the cable which was lost in the ocean's bed, in these words, says the New York Times:

"He was in the Great Eastern last year, and saw the cable when it broke; and he and Capt. Anderson at once took their observations so exact that they could go to the spot. After finding it they marked the line of the cable by a row of buoys, for fogs would come down and shut out sun and stars, so that no man could take an observation. These buoys were anchored a few miles apart. They were numbered, and each had a flagstaff on it, so that it could be seen by day, and a lantern by night.

NEILL IDENTIFIED.

As the Man Who Entered the House of Matilda Clover.

LONDON, Aug. 4.—Thomas Neill Cream, the alleged poisoner, was brought up yesterday on remand at the Bow-street Police Court charged with the murder of Matilda Clover on Oct. 21 at 27 Lambeth-road.

On that day he was seen by two women making the acquaintance of Matilda Clover and he was seen to enter her house after her. Masters and May waited to see if he would come out, but he did not, and he did not return to his lodgings that night.

There the matter rested as far as the facts of the death were concerned, but after an extraordinary state of things was disclosed. At the end of October and in November, when no one knew the truth as to the girl's death but the man who poisoned her, the prisoner asked Emily Sleeper, at whose house he lodged, to go around to Lambeth-road to enquire about a girl he knew who he thought had been poisoned, and on Nov 28 he wrote a black-mailing letter to Dr. Broadbent in which he definitely stated that Matilda Clover died through being poisoned by strychnine.

The principal witness to-day was Elizabeth Masters. At the beginning of October a man accosted her on Ludgate Hill and asked her to take a glass of wine. The witness identified Neill as the man, and also identified him as the associate of Matilda Clover.
