**Obituary.**  
 The Hamilton Times of the 29th ult. says: "Yesterday there died at 22 Sheaffe at one of the most venerable clergymen of this city - the Rev. Henry Lantou, who has sustained a superannuated relation to the Methodist church for the past twenty-three years. He first came to Hamilton in 1843, and for two years acted as one of the young clergymen in the circuit, which included MacNab-st. and the First Methodist churches. He entered the ministry in England in 1837, and immediately came to this country, being stationed at Quebec, where he was ordained for special purposes, and afterwards at Kingston was received into full connection with the conference. He was stationed at Stanstead, Peterboro, Hamilton, Belleville, Prescott, Perth and Bath. In 1863 he visited England and returning, spent a year at Vienna, and on account of failing health, was superannuated in 1865, taking up his residence in Hamilton. Mr. Lantou was a devout man, earnest in his work and endowed with all those peculiar gifts that go to make up a successful pastor. He loved the church and his work and it was with deep regret that he found his physical strength too weak to cope with the responsibilities of his calling. As a preacher he was possessed of much ability. He was learned in the scriptures, he was eloquent in his descriptions and illustrations, he was fervent in his appeals to mankind, to seek those paths that tended to goodness, purity and righteousness. Truly a noble and venerable pillar of the church has gone to rest. He was well known throughout the country for whenever able he was always willing to fill the pulpit of his brethren. His last illness was long and painful, yet he suffered in patience and was resigned to his Master's will. He most fittingly in his last moments exemplified the faith and trust that ever characterized his life. His funeral occurred this afternoon and was well attended, and Methodist clergymen of the city attended in a body."  
 The deceased left a widow and six daughters. One is Mrs. Neelands of this town.

**A Word of Warning.**  
 To the Editor of THE WATCHMAN.  
 Mr. Editor - For some time past the care-taker of Riverside cemetery, has been annoyed by people picking flowers from graves, and a number of complaints have been made by owners of lots, but until a few days ago could not bring the charge home to any one. He has the first time a respectable female in the act and watched her pick flowers and plants from a number of graves, until she had quite a number. He then approached her and charged her with having done so, and made her give them to him. The director held a meeting and came to the conclusion that a stop should be put to this practice, as the owners of lots and graves looked to the directors to protect them. The result was, that an informant saw and watched her, and moved to appear before that functionary. Before the day appointed for the hearing upon a number of the directors and pleaded to be let off. As it was the first time she had been set in motion, we thought she would temper justice with mercy, so he held a meeting and heard what the woman had to say for herself. "She did not think of any longer. We repented her and pointed out her what a cruel and heartless deed it was to interfere in any way with the flowers and plants and other things of affection placed upon the graves of our dear ones - then we withdrew the charge on payment of costs."  
 The directors are determined hereafter, to prosecute any one transgressing the law with the utmost rigor - and to let every one know what the law is, I give an extract of the act respecting cemeteries, chapter 178, revised statutes of Ontario - Section 34. - (1) Any person who willfully destroys, mutilates, defaces, or removes any tomb, monument, grave-stone, or other structure placed in a cemetery, or any fence railing, or other work of protection or ornament of a cemetery, or any other structure aforesaid or of any cemetery lot within a cemetery; or  
 (2) Willfully destroys, cuts, breaks, or injures, any tree, shrub, or plant in a cemetery; or  
 (3) Plays at any game or sport in a cemetery; or  
 (4) Discharges fire-arms (save at a military funeral) in a cemetery; or who  
 (5) Willfully and unlawfully disturbs or removes any monument or other object of a body therein; or who  
 (6) Commits a nuisance in a cemetery shall upon conviction before a Justice of the Peace or other court of competent jurisdiction be punished by a fine of not more than \$40 according to the nature of the offence.
