A visit to the Lowe farms, near Morris, | ____ Manitoba, affords an instructive outing to those who are interested in improved farm machinery. Mr. Stevenson's ideal farm would doubtless be a world wonder; in fact it is quite wonderful to hear him tell of the appliances which he has already had in opperation. One of his curiosities is a traction engine, which ploughs and threshers, gathering up ts customers and never sell inown fuel (straw) as it traveles around.
