EGGS AND EGGS. Let the Quality Be Improved and Prices Vary Accordingly.

The custom which has always prevailed in this country of selling eggs by the dozen has well nigh fixed in the mind of the producer and consumer the idea that an egg is an egg. In our market the name egg is almost exclusively applied to a hen's egg of any size, just so that it is reasonably fresh and counts to make up the dozen.

But any one, either among the producers or consumers of eggs, who has thought of or has tasted good eggs knows that the quality as well as the quantity depends not only upon the chicken, but much more largely upon the character of the food supplied to the laying hens.

The time is fast approaching when eggs, like beef, will be sold by the pound and selected for their quality. Every one knows that poorly fed cattle or hogs cannot produce for the market good beef or pork, although every animal may have the same number of bones and muscles as those that have been well fed. The poultry of the hen or farmyard should have as much attention, if good eggs are to be produced, at least as the swine when we would have good pork.
