 THE year 1881 will be a mathematical curiosity. From right to left and left to right reads the same. Eighteen divided by 2 gives 9 as a quotient; 81 divided by 9 gives 9; if divided by 9 the quotient contains a 9; if multiplied by 9 the product contains two 9's; 1 and 8 are 9, 8 and 1 are 9. If the 18 be placed under the 81 and added the sum is 99. If the figures be added thus: 1, 8, 8, 1, it will give 18. Reading from left to right it is 18, and 18 is two-ninths of 81. By adding, dividing and multiplying 19 9's are produced, being one nine for each year required to complete the century.
