Californian Topics.

For the past month we have been enjoying the most beautiful weather it is possible to imagine. The sky of a beautiful deep blue and with not a cloud to mar its beauty, and a pleasant eyen temperature of about 65 degrees, This is a pleasant contrast to Canadian weather where in all probability you will be enjoying alternations of snow, slush, rain, mud and piercing cold. The physical atmosphere of this country is pleasant, bracing and life giving for the invalid. The moral atmosphere is also pleasant and bracing for the criminal and just in as great a degree as the physical atmosphere is pure and life giving, so the moral atmosphere is foul and impure. The masses have become so familiarized with crime in its every aspect that to have embezzled, robbed or even murdered is of no great detri ment to a person, provided first, the criminal has wealth or can surround his crime with a certain romantic glamour. In the latter event he is lionized by a certain class of weak-minded men and idiotic females of which there is a great number among Americans. It is a notorious fact that to secure the conviction of a wealthy criminal is almost an impossibility. The Jury Bribing System finds a great number of able exponents in this country and every imaginable means are used to defeat the ends of justice, the Bribing System sometimes being used with favorable effect on Jury, Council, Judge and all the court hangers on. An apparently never-ending source of amusement for Pacific Coast benedicts is the securing of divorces. This little ceremony is accomplished with about as much despatch and as little expense as the marriage. There are five divorce bureaus in San Francisco, and all do a rushing business. Through the medium of these bureaus the applicants are sundered at the least expense in the least time and with the least ceremony at prices ranging from \$25 per couple up. The Californian divorce mill grinds at the rate of about six couples per diem. In this little town of Santa Cruz we have a Mayor who a short time ago embezzled to the amount of \$20,000. In Canada the unromantic like a Canadian June. and unsympathising multitude would feel like putting him in jail. But here, the finer fibred Americans don't believe in any such prosaic proceedings. They look at it this way, "here is a man with a tremendous amount of undeveloped talent in the embezzeling line and it would be a shame and disgrace to nip in the bud any display of such talent, it might tend to keep down similiar displays in the rising youth and at the same time squelch one of the most promising products of our institutions" So they keep him in the office of Mayor and elect him to another office over the head of an honest and trustworthy man. Instances like the foregoing might be multiplied, but I think enough has been said to show that, morally at least. Canada has everything to gain by comparison. California is at present having the greatest boom in its history since the famous Gold period of 1849. At that time it was the craze for Gold now it is the fever for land. Then, the northern part of the State received all the benefit now the south is having its turn. In numbers the rush of 1887 is far greater than that of 1849, over two hundred thousand people having come into the State since October. Some of these for ple asure, some for health but the greater number to settle. With few except tions all this number have betook them. selves to Southern California, to Los Angelos, San Diego, Santa Barbera, San Bernardino or some of the smaller places in the boom region. Los Angeles

and San Diego are instances of a mar-

vellously rapid growth of population,

The great fault of booms is that everything is overdone and in this case it is pretty well overdone. The limits are out for a population of 1,800,000 just 800,000 more than the present population of the whole state, while in Los Angeles they calculate on the moderate number of two million. Notwithstanding all this there is a great deal of healthy progress, and San Diego is undoubtedly the most rapidly grown city of modern times. Seeding is almost over here now and in some places grain is above the ground, although it does seem rather incongruous to speak of seeding in December. Harvest will be over by the middle of June. California is the greatest wheat exporting state in the union, the annual export reaching to over 23,000,000 bushels, and the present price is about 81 cents per bushel. Timothy is never grown here for hay, what is known under the name of hay is wheat cut when slightly green. This sells at from 18 to 20 dollars per ton. The harvesting process is entirely different to ours, there being no Self Binders or Reapers required. whole process of Reaping, Threshing, Cleaning and Sacking up ready for shipment, going on at the one time. They use what is called a 'Header,' this cuts off the grain about six inches below the head, and loads into a wagon which is driven alongside. When this wagon is full another takes its place and it deposits its load at the Threshing Machine. After being cleaned and sacked up-one hundred pound bags being used-these bags are then piled up in the field and left until such time as it is deemed best to ship, sometimes being left three or four months in the open air, there being no danger from rain in summer, thunderstorms being about as frequent as earthquakes. After having the grain taken off, the straw is either ploughed under or burnt. This dissertation upon seed time and harvestimay seem strange with with at this season, but here a person can easily imagine harvest a very short distance off, as since the last rains everything has taken on a beautiful fresh coat of green which makes it look
