A CORRESPONDENT of the Chicago Medical Times recommends Mr. Gezon's formula as a cure for corns, which is as follows:—E Salicylic acid, 30 parts, or grs. x; extract cantharid. 2 parts, or grs. v; solution, 540 parts, or f. 8 ss. The Times says:—The colloid fixes the acid on the diseased part, and gives speedy relief by protecting it from friction. The cantharid. indica acts as an anodyne, and the acid reduces and loosens the corn so that it comes off in four or five days, adhering to the colloid. The remedy is applied with a camel's-hair pencil, and if the corn is not well cured the application may be repeated. In four or five days the patient should use a warm foot-bath and rub off the colloid. If any portion of the corn remains the acid should be applied again, and the treatment continued until the whole of the corn has disappeared. The skin will be soft and smooth, as in the healthy state.

A few nights since the dwelling of Mr. Neil Morrison, an industrious settler of the township of Thorah, was destroyed by fire. With difficulty Mr. Morrison saved his four young children from the flames without any clothing but their night dresses. The mercury at the time stood 12° below zero. Mr. Morrison made his way to his nearest neighbour, a mile distant and on reaching there was so exhausted that he could hardly speak and his bare feet were badly frozen. The neighbour hastened to the children and found them in an insensible condition. All have since recovered. The neighbours have kindly furnished the sufferers with warm clothing and other necessities.—Globe.
