

A Lizard Seventeen Years in a Man's Stomach.

Mr. John Bradley, who at Healy Falls, in Seymour, called at the office of the Campbellford Herald on Monday last, and acquainted the editor with the remarkable statement that he had been relieved of a lizard which has made its abode in his stomach for seventeen years. The little creature found its way into the prison where it was confined that great length of time while Mr. Bradley drank from a brook. In July last, Mr. Bradley consulted Dr. Bvam, of Campbellford, who told him it might be possible that a lizard was in his stomach. The doctor commenced to treat him for this trouble and was successful in killing it. Mr. Bradley says he could clearly feel every movement of the lizard until it died. It afterwards passed from him in pieces, one of which had a sharp-pointed claw. Mr. Bradley during his seventeen years of illness has consulted twenty physicians, and only found relief as he was a patient to give up all hopes of being relieved. He gained strength and is now in perfect health, rejoiced beyond measure at his recovery after so many years suffering.

Where Public School Education Should Stop.

"Our school money," said General Butler in his last inaugural message to the Massachusetts Assembly "is diverted from the many to whom it does belong." There is much truth in that State of which Boston is the intellectual centre. In their present state of development, it is becoming plainly evident that our public schools are away from the original idea of what constitutes a public school, viz: the imparting of elementary and useful instruction for the masses. There are three kinds of education which may be attained, - elementary, professional and ornamental.

The first, we contend, is a necessity in this age, and should be paid for by the State; the second is for individual advancement, and should be paid for by the individual receiving it, and the third is a luxury or an accomplishment, and its enjoyment, like all luxuries, should be at the expense of the one who indulges. Because the people, as a valued exchange remarks, are willing to expend money on free education, quacks, theorists and various interested individuals, and we have a great number of such - have been gradually extending the course of instruction, so that it is no longer confined to the elementary branches of study required by the many, but is made to include the purely ornamental branches required by the few. The consequence has been an extravagant increase in the appropriations; the cost of a tuition in the fancy additions, and of keeping up institutes established in the pursuance of such extension being vastly greater than that required for ordinary school education. Reading, writing, spelling composition, geography, and possibly, history may be regarded as constituting the essential basis of any education. Algebra, geometry, French, Latin, chemistry, physics, natural philosophy, history, etc., etc., cannot in any sense be looked upon as elementary. They are either professional or ornamental, and the case may be, are studied by comparatively few, and the expense should not be saddled on the public shoalder. Educational authorities are trying to make free public schools grasp everything. The result is, scholars of public schools are graduated, being an intellectual conglomeration of much that is useless, and little that is really useful. The Ontario Legislature has a subject in the present educational position that is well worth its attention. If money is to be expended from the public purse for post public school instruction, let it be for industrial schools. Where there is one boy or girl who needs algebra, geometry and the rest of the luxury course, there are a hundred who require to be taught how to earn a living.

There is an egg problem which is said to be afflicting to the small mathematicians of neighboring cities. Here it is: Two men enter a grocery with 30 eggs each. The groceryman agrees to pay one at the rate of 1 cent for 2 eggs, and the other 1 cent for 3 eggs, which is 2 cents for every 5 eggs. It is clear that he paid one man 15 cents for his eggs and the other 10 cents for his eggs. A third man comes in for eggs and the groceryman says, "I will sell these eggs at the same rate I bought them, that is 2 cents for 5 eggs." They were sold, and it is plain that they only brought 24 cents. The groceryman just lost 1 cent by the transaction. How did this occur?
