### Bexley.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.—Council met at Cobocokk the 9th day of February, pursuant to adjournment. Present, N. Heaslip, reeve, councillors Cameron, Ham and Atcheson. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved. By-law No. 183, a by-law to prevent the obstruction of highways in the township of Bexley, was passed in usual manner. Mr. Ham moved, seconded by Mr. Cameron, that \$13.59 be accepted in full arrears of taxes against lots 33 and 34, N. W. B.—Carried. Mr. Heaslip moved seconded by Mr. Ham, that the clerk be instructed to have 50 copies of by-law No. 183 printed for distribution.—Carried. Mr. Cameron moved, seconded by Mr. Atcheson, that Capt. Corson be heard at the next meeting of the council in regard to his claim for 7 acres of lot 6 in 7 con.—Carried. Mr. Cameron moved, seconded by Mr. Ham that the auditors' report for 1883 as now read be adopted.—Carried. Mr. Cameron moved seconded by Mr. Atcheson, that orders be granted in favor of the auditors for \$4 each for their services.—Carried. Mr. Ham moved, seconded by Mr. Cameron, that the time for collecting the taxes be extended until the 22nd day of March, and that the corporate seal be attached to this motion to give it effect of a by-law.—Carried. Mr. Cameron moved, seconded by Mr. Heaslip, that the clerk be instructed to procure seven copies of Municipal Councillors hand-book from Messrs Pratt & Tracy, of Stratford.—Carried. Mr. Atcheson moved, seconded by Mr. Cameron, that orders on the treasure be granted as follows:—A. H. Care, account for stone hammers, \$5.52; E. B. LeRoy, on account of salary, \$35, to purchase hand-books, \$7. Council adjourned to meet at Victoria Road on 22nd March next.
