Second meeting of the Eldon Council held at Hector Campbell's Hotel, Kirkfield, on Saturday the 12th day of March, 1881.

Members present, William McKenzie, E. D. McEachern, Peter R. McEachern, D. A. McIntyre and William McKee. Moved by E. D. McEachern seconded by Wm. McKee, that Arch. Mitchell be allowed time to pay his taxes until George Shield's contract for Eldon drain is finished...

Moved by P. R. McEachern, seconded by E. D. McEachern, that the Reeve give his order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$12.00 in favor of Geo. Fisk, \$10.00 to be expended for the benefit of Mary McLinnis and \$2.00 for the benefit of Sarah McKinnon; also in favour of Alex. McPherson for the sum of \$5.00 for the benefit of Mrs. Elson; also in favour of Wm. McKenzie for the sum of \$5.00 for the benefit of Mrs. Cumberland, indigents.

Moved by E. D. McEachern, seconded by P. R. McEachern, that the Collector be instructed to return his roll by the 1st May, 1881; and that the Clerk be instructed to notify Arch. Ray, John and Duncan Ray, George Real and John A. Jackson to remove all obstructions out of the creek running through their lands...

Moved by Wm. McKee, seconded by E. D. McEachern, that the Auditor's Report for 1880 be received and adopted.

Moved by D. McIntyre, seconded by E. D. McEachern, that the Reeve give his order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$15.00 in favour of Robt. Campbell (fines collected in Kirkfield and to be expended on sidewalks).

Moved by Wm. McKee, seconded by D. A. McIntyre, that the Reeve give his order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$20.00 in favour of Donald Campbell for commission on road jobs.

Moved by E. D. McEachern, seconded by D. A. McIntyre, that Daniel Swinson be allowed 3 years taxes on his lot W 25, con. 10, for ditching and turnpiking 31 rods on the 10th con. line opposite lot 25 similar to the road between his lot and Portage Road.

Moved by E. D. McEachern, seconded by P. R. McEachern, that W. A. Silverwood be authorized to get the 5th Qr road surveyed across the concession and part of the Victoria Road, and that this council to pay on day of survey.

Moved by Wm. McKee, seconded by D. A. McIntyre, that the Reeve give his order on the Treasurer for the sum of \$8.00 in favour of M. O'Neill for auditing Township Accounts for 1880, and \$11.00 in favour of David Sidey for auditing Township Accounts and entering the same in audit book; also in favour of Jos. J. Carr for the sum of \$6.25 for printing in 1880; also in favour of Andrew Morrison for the sum of \$19.00 for School Lists, selecting Jurors and delivering Ballot Boxes.

Moved by Wm. McKee, seconded by D. A. McIntyre, that this council now adjourn to meet again as a Court of Revision on Wednesday the 25th of May, 1881, at P. McGuire's Hotel, Hartley.
