**RATEPAYERS' MEETING.**

A meeting of the ratepayers of the Police Village of Woodville was held Tuesday evening last in the Town Hall, Mr. W. C. White in the chair. The Chairman stated that the meeting had been called by the Police Trustees to discuss ways and means of procuring some money for the repair of the sidewalks and for building necessary walls, and also for other purposes in connection with the village.

Moved by Mr. A. Campbell, seconded by Mr. J. C. Gilchrist, that a petition be presented to the Councils of Mariposa and Eldon, to allow villagers to expend their statutory labor on the sidewalks of this village, the same to be collected by the Pathmasters and paid to the trustees.—Carried.
