

Our Village Fathers.

April 21st 1888. The Council met as adjourned. Members all present. Minutes of last meeting read and adopted. Petition presented, signed by 54 ratepayers, praying that a sidewalk be constructed along Simcoe street to the lake. Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Treleaven, that the statement prepared shewing the figures necessary to raise \$2800.00, upon the instalment principal be now introduced and discussed.—Carried. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Westcott, that the debentures to raise \$2800.00, to provide for railway liabilities of this corporation be issued upon the instalment principal.—Carried. Moved by Mr. Treleaven, seconded by Mr. Campbell, that the above debentures be issued in sums of \$200 each bearing interest at 6 per cent. per annum, payable yearly.—Carried. Moved by Mr. Westcott, seconded by Mr. Young, that By-law No. 5, of 1888, to authorize the issue of debentures to provide for the railway liability of this Corporation be introduced and read.—Carried. By-law read and discussed. Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Campbell, that By-law No. 5, of 1888, be now passed as read.—Carried. By-law passed. Moved by Mr. Westcott, seconded by Mr. Campbell, that the clerk be instructed to reply to the communication received from the Thorah council at last meeting that this council will not require to advertise for the sale of our debentures.—Carried. Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Westcott, that any parties whose names appear on the Collector's Roll of 1887, as having paid taxes less than \$2.00 upon a regular assessment and an addition of \$1.50, be refunded 50 cents, as the By-law only requires an addition of \$1.00.—Carried. Moved by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Westcott, that the village Streets Commissioner be instructed to collect the village poll tax by June 1st 1888, and where necessary to enforce the By-law in that case made and provided.—Carried. Moved by Mr. Treleaven, seconded by Mr. Westcott, that this Council adjourn to meet on Monday, May 7th, at 7 p. m.—Carried.
