The account of the gallant saving of a life recorded below deserves more than a passing notice, and the act of bravery ought to be awarded by the bestowal of a medal similar to those granted to persons saving life from a watery grave, and we hope a representation to that effect will be made in the proper quarter.—Mr. A. Lawr is a driver on the local train running between the Midland Junction and Toronto, on the Toronto & Nipissing railway. His train starts at four o'clock in the afternoon. On Saturday he was passing along King street, a short distance east of George street, about half an hour before train time, when he was startled by a wild cry overhead. Glancing up he observed a child descending from the second storey window of a house. Ad. took in the situation at a glance and placing himself directly underneath the falling child he caught it in his upstretched arms. The shock brought him to his knees, but he retained his hold of the little one, and after recovering himself, he placed his burden safely in a standing position on the sidewalk. The mother of the child hearing the cry, came with great haste to the street, fully expecting to see its mangled form on the sidewalk. She was overcome with joy on finding it unharmed in any way. Her warmest thanks were given to the brave man who effected the rescue. She explained that her girl had been playing with a younger sister in a room overlooking the street. The window had been raised, the shutters were drawn but as afterwards appeared, not fastened. In their play, the child that had such a narrow escape from death fell against the shutters, which gave way and occasioned the adventure in which Mr. Lawr played such a noble and praiseworthy part. The rescue was witnessed by a number of persons who added their praises to those of the mother. After hearing the explanations offered, Mr. Lawr examined his watch, and finding that train time was approaching raised his hat to the mother and continued his journey towards the Nipissing station.
