

Local Matters.

Mr. M. UMPHREY'S mill, one mile from Udon, was burned on 2nd inst., loss about \$2,500. The fire originated from a shaft running on a wooden box.

The steamer Cobocook which plys between Fenou Falls and Cobocook ran against a snag on Friday morning last just before entering the locks at Rosedale, breaking a large hole in her bottom. She quickly filled and sank inside the locks.

"JOHNSY" SKAE, an old Oshawa boy, boy, manipulated Sierra Nevada stock so successfully that he became a millionaire to whom San Francisco paid obsequies. Then he slipped, lost every dollar, became a vagabond, and last year was condemned to prison for drunkenness. Now he is out again in broad cloth and beaver, and it is reported that he recently cleared \$250,000 in mining speculations.

RETURNS of traffic of the Midland Railway of Canada for the week ending May 15th, 1882, were as follows:—Passengers and mails, \$1,222.65; freight, \$18,053.98, total, \$22,276.63, as compared with \$15,518.14 for the corresponding week of 1881, being an increase of \$6,758.49; and the aggregate traffic to date of \$20,088.67, being an increase of \$3,474.64 over 1881.

FROM the assessment roll of the village of Cannington we learn that the total value of real and personal property assessed for the present year is 261,880, being \$1,929 less than last year. The number of children of school age is put down at 245 being 41 less than last year, while the total population is placed at 1,147 or 14 more than last year. Evidently the returns are not as reliable as the original list.—*Leaver.*

THE night train from Toronto over the Midland combination, made a fast run one day last week. It left Toronto one hour and ten minutes late, and reached Lindsay only about fifteen minutes behind time. The run from Woodville to Lindsay—thirty miles—was made in 26 minutes. The time allowed under the old system to cover this distance was one hour. A Lawr was the driver of this train, and is one of the best and most careful drivers on the road. Passengers travelling under his care may rest assured they are safe with him.—*Guardian.*
