Our Country's Trade.
Who we buy from and what we buy.

Though the total value of goods enter-
ed last year for consumption was under
\$100,000,000, more than \$85,000,000 was
monopolized between the United King-
dom and the United States alone. We
find the returns from the former to be—
dutiable goods, \$30,385,797; free goods,
\$10,215,402; total, \$40,601,999. From
the latter—dutiable goods, \$29,659,876;
free goods, \$15,193,163; total, \$44,853,-
039.

A "bad third" is Germany, \$2,155,523;
next, France, \$1,975,518; the Spanish,
British and French West Indies, \$1,658,-
782, \$1,486,321 and \$1,443,102 respec-
tively, the only other one exceeding a
million being Brazil, credited with \$1,-
100,965. China keeps just short of it
with \$946,264.

Of this total of dutiable goods entered
for home consumption, Ontario and
Quebec stand nearly even as to the a-
mount respectively credited to each,
namely, \$28,594,041 for the former and
and \$28,168,203 the latter. Of the re-
mainder, \$8,272,033 are divided between
Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, leav-
ing the comparatively small balance to
the other provinces and the territories.

In return and partial exchange for
this importation of nearly one hundred
millions dollars' worth of goods for our
home consumption, we have a set off of
\$85,251,314 in the shape of goods we
have sold for consumption abroad. Here
again, as already shown in the case of
our imports, we find the United King-
dom and the United States going far
towards monopolizing the whole. The
former purchased of us during the last
fiscal year to the extent of \$41,540,304
and the latter as much as \$33,747,471.

All other countries are, in sporting, par-
lance "nowhere" in the race, Newfound-
land making a modest third with \$1,-
751,974, and the British West Indies
coming next with \$1,256,649. It is
thus found that practically our dealings
are confined to the English-speaking
people, whether fellow-subjects or other.
Our export trade with France is but
\$534,363 and with Germany even less
than half of that insignificant sum,
namely \$253,293. Three articles of
export of themselves account for more
than three-fourths of the total.—namely,
animals and their produce, \$23,077,513;
produce of the forest, \$22,835,087; and
agricultural products, \$21,441,817. The
produce of the fisheries is placed at \$6,-
869,033, and that of the mine at \$4,147,-
287. Another noteworthy item is that
of manufactures, to the estimated value
of \$3,305,337.

The tables of exports by Provinces is
officially made up thus: Ontario, \$27,-
633,363; Quebec, \$33,171,339; Nova
Scotia, \$8,071,513; New Brunswick,
\$6,547,066; Manitoba, \$652,615; British
Columbia, \$2,953,616; Prince Edward
Island, \$1,563,267. Here, as already re-
marked in reference to our import tables
in connection with the place of final
consumption, we again fail to elicit the
value of the goods actually produced by
each province.
