The notice does not appear to do any good from year to year, for the thistles are as bad as ever, and many farms in this country are much depreciated in value by this and other noxious weeds.—E.A.

For some time past the weather has been so unfavorable to vegetation that the farmers are beginning to complain, some of them alleging that the crops will not exceed, even if they are up to the average. No doubt the night frosts have done considerable harm and the cold days have checked the growth of almost everything; but it will take a great deal to counteract the effects of the splendid rains in the early part of the season, and it is too soon yet to give up hopes of an abundant harvest.

We understand the idea of voting on a sidewalk levy has been abandoned and the next method proposed is to take up a private subscription among the villagers for sidewalk building purposes. This, certainly, is the most just method. By the system of assessment the greater portion of the levy would fall upon three or four individuals whose property comes within the bounds of the police village and, who individually use the sidewalks but little. These parties are quite willing to contribute liberally towards the improvements but naturally object to being called on to defray more than one half the cost. If a subscription list is handed round we do not doubt but that a very handsome sum can be obtained.

As the special train which left Cobocok on Saturday evening for Midland Junction, was approaching the North Bay Bridge, a dark object was seen by the driver lying across the track, when on near approach he discovered it to be a boy about eleven years of age, a son of Mr. Geo. Mathieson, living near Corson's Siding. It appears the boy was sent to Cobocok for a jug of whiskey by some men who were fishing, the little fellow not thinking of any danger had partaken of the contents. He was taken back to Cobocok but did not become conscious until Sunday morning. The only bruises the boy received were a slight cut on his mouth and a bruise on the forehead supposed to have been inflicted by falling on the rails. An engine and nine cars passed over the boy.

MANY people labor under the delusive idea that only by going to a foreign town can goods be obtained at reasonable prices, and many from this neighbourhood are in the habit of going long distances with their trade while under this impression. We have frequently pointed out the fact that by so doing they are really injuring themselves. Our merchants are able to buy, and do buy, as cheaply as those of any other place, while freights and other expenses are quite as low here as elsewhere. A reference to the prices quoted in our columns will convince reasonable people that Woodville merchants do sell as cheap and in many lines even cheaper, than can be got elsewhere. With these facts in view we do not see why farmers from this neighbourhood should drive to Lindsay, Port Perry, Whitby, and even Orillia, or any distant town to transact their business as at present is frequently the case. It certainly is more to their interests to promote the growth of business in their own midst than to carry it to distant places.
