Lieut. Governor Masson has resigned in consequence of ill-health.

The strike of miners at Reserve mine, C. B., has been settled.

Ten miles of the Gatineau Valley railway will be built this summer. The new Welland canal has been opened

to vessels drawing fourteen feet. Mr. Wright, of Ottawa, has commenced

operations at his silver mine on Lake Tamiscamingue. Mr. Moffat, the Government candidate,

was elected by acclamation in Restigouche, N. B., on Saturday.

Prominent Scott Act workers in Coaticook have been subjected for months past to systematic persecution and outrage.

It is expected the Canadian Pacific bridge over the St. Lawrence at Lachine will be completed and trains crossing it in about a month.

Never before in the history of Manitoba to attend the Queen's jubilee services. have there been such prospects of an abundant crop. The germination has been rapid and the growth vigorous.

Chief of Police McRae, of Winnipeg, was shot in the leg recently, while arresting a notorious cattle thief named Joe Fl nt. The wound is not considered dangerous.

railway entered Vancouver, B. C., last Monday, and was received with great rejoicing, the town being 'gaily decorated in honour of the event.

The Winnipeg City Council has voted five hundred dollars for relief of the Nanaimo sufferers, and have also extended an invitation to His Excellency Lord Lansdowne to visit Winnipeg this summer.

An agreement has been made between the Michigan Central and the Canadian Pacific railways whereby the latter secures an entrance into Chicago and will use the Wa-bash road to East St. Louis.

Sir Charles Tupper directs the attention of exporters of cereals, fruits and dairy produce to the facilities afforded by the Liverpool Exhibition for showing specimens of their goods to the English public.

A petition to the Dominion Government praying for certain amendments to the Lands Act has been drafted by a committee appointed at a public meeting held in Regina, and has been forwarded to Ottawa.

Mr. Buchanan will temporarily assume the duties of the late Mr. Smithers as general manager of the Bank of Montreal, whose successor will not be appointed until after the annual meeting of the bank.

Mr. La Riviere, in his Budget speech in the Manitoba Legislature, refused to countenance any further aid to the Hudson's Bay railway until proof was given that the line could be carried through to completion.

A proposition for the reopening of the London Steel Works, and the employment of 150 to 200 workmen, has been made to the corporation of that city by a wealthy firm of Cleveland, Ohio, on certain conditions.

It is reported that the Manitoba Government will aid the Hudson's Bay railway by a guarantee of \$4,500,000 on condition that the company raises an equal sum and gives satisfactory assurances for the completion of the road.

The Canadian Government has discontinued the bonus certificates offered for the past two or three years to emigrants proceeding to British Columbia. Now, however, through rates are quoted by the Canadian Pacific railway.

The Canadian mortuary statistics for the month of April have been issued. The deaths were as follows: Montreal 441, Quebec 120, Hamilton 88, St. John 48, London 39, Hull 20, Toronto 213, Kingston 28, and Ottawa 72.

In reply to a request from the council of Whitewater, Man., for the extension of the Manitoba South-Western railway, Mr. Van-Horne stated that the Canadian Pacific Railway Company had no money to expend on branches in Manitoba.






