ASES IN NEW YORK .-- MORTALITY INCREASES IN NEW YORK .-- MORTALITY INCREASES

New York, July 26 .- The British steamhip Alnwy Castle arrived yesterday from Havana with the second mate suffering from vellow fever. The officer was placed in the hospital. Two families from Memphis arrived here on Tuesday, comprising eleven persons. Mrs. Breman, of the party, was taken sick and died of yellow fever yesteray morning. Fitzgibbons and wife of the ame party were taken sick when the physiians removed them and all the rest of the party, to quarantine in the harbor. The ocality where the sickness occurred is a langerous one, being in tenement houses on East 109th street. Thorough disinfection nd fumigation have been applied by the ealth authorities.

THE DISEASE SPREADING.

Memphis, Tenn., July 26 .- Yesterday was amp and disagreeable. The weather is unavorable to the sick, and the increase in the umber of deaths can be attributed to the hange in the atmosphere. To this date there ave been 120 cases of fever. Of these 36 ave died, which shows a mortality of 30 er cent. The old infected districts of 1873 nd 1878 were exempt from fever until yeserday. As a striking instance of immunity rom a second attack of the disease is cited he illness in the family of P. G. Meath. ast year seven members of the family were ricken. Three of his children were sent broad and of these three Patrick Meath , was prostrated with the disease 10 days go and soon died. Mrs. Meath, another of hose sent away last year, is in a critical conition, while none of the seven who were ck last year have been effected in the

PRECAUTIONS.

New York, July 26.—Precautions were taken at the general post office of this city yesterday for the first time to prevent the dissemination of yellow fever by means of mail matter from Memphis and other doubtful localities. Postmaster James ordered a liberal supply of disinfectants, and all mail bags and packages from the South will be thoroughly treated. Three mails arrive here via Memphis daily,

Fuschias, after being exhausted with blooming, should have the terminal shoots of all their branches clipped off; then set aside for two or three weeks, giving very little water, then repot in a soil composed of well decomposed leaf mould, mixed with a sprinkle of good garden soil, a few rusty nails, and a layer of charcoal at the bottom of the pot to secure good drainage. In a few weeks new shoots full of flower buds will start all over, growing rapidly.
