WEIGHTS AND MEASURES.

The following inspection districts have been fixed under the new Weights and Measures Act:—

ONTARIO.

Windsor.—To comprise the Counties of Essex, Kent, Lambton, Bruce, Huron and Perth.

London.—To comprise the City of London, and Counties of Elgin, Middlesex, Oxford, Norfolk and Brant.

Hamilton.—To comprise the city of Hamilton, and Counties of Haldimand, Welland, Lincoln, Niagara, Wentworth, Waterloo, Wellington, Halton and Monk.

Toronto.—To comprise the City of Toronto, and Counties of Grey, Simcoe, Muskoka, Peel, Cardwell, York, Ontario and Algoma.

Belleville.—To comprise the City of Belleville, and Counties of Victoria, Durham, Northumberland, Peterborough, Hastings, and Prince Edward.

Kingston.—To comprise the city of Kingston, Counties of Lennox, Addington, Frontenac, Leeds and Grenville, Town of Brockville, Counties of Dundas, Glengarry and Town of Cornwall.

Ottawa.—To comprise the city of Ottawa and Counties of Prescott, Russel, Carleton, Lanark, Renfrew and the Counties of Ottawa and Pontiac, including City of Hull, in the Province of Quebec.

THE YELLOW FEVER.

CASES IN NEW YORK.—MORTALITY INCREASING IN MEMPHIS.

New York, July 26.—The British steamship Alway Castle arrived yesterday from Havana with the second mate suffering from yellow fever. The officer was placed in the hospital. Two families from Memphis arrived here on Tuesday, comprising eleven persons. Mrs. Breman, of the party, was taken sick and died of yellow fever yesterday morning. Fitzgibbons and wife of the same party were taken sick when the physicians removed them and all the rest of the party, to quarantine in the harbor. The locality where the sickness occurred is a dangerous one, being in tenement houses on East 109th street. Thorough disinfection and fumigation have been applied by the health authorities.

THE DISEASE SPREADING.

Memphis, Tenn., July 26.—Yesterday was damp and disagreeable. The weather is unfavorable to the sick, and the increase in the number of deaths can be attributed to the change in the atmosphere. To this date there have been 120 cases of fever. Of these 36 have died, which shows a mortality of 30 per cent. The old infected districts of 1873 and 1878 were exempt from fever until yesterday. As a striking instance of immunity from a second attack of the disease is cited the illness in the family of P. G. Meath. Last year seven members of the family were stricken. Three of his children were sent abroad and of these three Patrick Meath, was prostrated with the disease 10 days ago and soon died. Mrs. Meath, another of those sent away last year, is in a critical condition, while none of the seven who were sick last year have been effected in the east.

REFUGEES NOT WANTED.

Nashville, July 26.—Refugees from Memphis are having a rough time of it in interior towns. They are looked upon as carrying the seeds of pestilence, and the moment one complains of any sort of illness he is put down as a yellow fever subject; the house occupied by the unfortunate is shunned and he suddenly finds himself isolated. The fear of yellow fever is so intense in character that Memphians are often peremptorily and abruptly invited out of houses even by old

PRECAUTIONS.

New York, July 26.—Precautions were taken at the general post office of this city yesterday for the first time to prevent the dissemination of yellow fever by means of mail matter from Memphis and other doubtful localities. Postmaster James ordered a liberal supply of disinfectants, and all mail bags and packages from the South will be thoroughly treated. Three mails arrive here via Memphis daily.

FUSCHIAS, after being exhausted with blooming, should have the terminal shoots of all their branches clipped off; then set aside for two or three weeks, giving very little water, then repot in a soil composed of well decomposed leaf mould, mixed with a sprinkle of good garden soil, a few rusty nails, and a layer of charcoal at the bottom of the pot to secure good drainage. In a few weeks new shoots full of flower buds will start all over, growing rapidly.
