On the 6th inst., a School exhibition consisting of dialogues, recitations, music, &c., was held in the senior department of our School, which was very interesting. We regret, however, that no opportunity was afforded for the examination of the children in the several studies pursued there during the quarter now closed. It is true they were asked a number of questions and put through a certain routine of work previously arranged and prepared, and contained in a programme which the teacher held in his hands; but this, we presume, was only a part of the entertainment and not intended to show the children's knowledge in the different subjects gone over. Entertainments such as these are very nice in their way, but we would much prefer a thorough examination of the School by the trustees and visitors present, as far more satisfactory, if not to the teacher, at least to the parents and guardians of the child, who pierce the exhibition of practical knowledge, however imperfect to the necessary and evanescent cramming for such demonstrations no matter how enjoyable, and however brilliant they may appear. On the following day the Junior Division, taught by Miss Angus, gave an entertainment, in some respects similar, with this important difference that instead of questioning the children herself in ritualistic fashion, she left the school entirely to the tender mercies of the visitors present, to be examined by them as they saw fit. The examination which was a most searching one, was conducted by Mr. A. Cuthbertson, of University College, Toronto, assisted by Mr. J. McEwen and Mr. John McTaggart, and the result reflected no discredit upon the industry and ability of the teacher.
