

Apour one o'clock yesterday afternoon, (12th inst) a smash-up took place on the Midland, at Cannington station. It appears, a special freight was on its way north, with goods for the different places along the line. and while delivering freight at the station, another special freight, also on its way north, came along, and made an unsuccessful attempt to pass on a single track, resulting in placing the locomotive of the latter, and about a dozen empty box and flat cars, hors de combat. Only two of the disabled cars belonged to the first train. The locomotive did not leave the track, but the freight cars were thrown promisenously on either side of the line, and some of them pretty badly wrecked. One flat car tried to climb a telegraph pole, but the pole was not strong enough and gave way under the weight. Other of the flat cars were turned completely over into the ditch, and one box car took up its position over the well, at au angle of forty-five degrees, one end being in the ditch, and the other projecting over the track. Fortunately there was no loss of life, the only casualty being that one of tho brakesmen had his face somewhat cut by being thrown among a pile of trucks. His injuries are but slight, however though it is almost a miracle that he escaped with his life. A wrecking train was soon on the spot from Uxbridge, and by dint of hard work the line was got clear shortly before ten o'clock, p. m. The disabled locomotive will have to be taken to the shops for repairs, and will need a pretty thorough over hauling before it is fit for service again .-Gleaner.
