English Raspberry Jam.

A grocer, named John Acca, of Westminster, was summoned yesterday for selling, to the prejudice of the purchaser, an article of food, to wit, jam, which was not of the nature, substance and quality demanded. The article which was sold by the defendant as "raspberry" jam was analyzed by Dr. Dupré, whose certificate read as follows: "The jam contains no raspberries at all, but chiefly consists of a mixture of gooseberries, black currants, etc., with the addition of some seeds, not identified, and colored by rosaniline (one of the coal tar colors). The seeds and coloring matter are added to give the mixture the appearance of the genuine article, and the presence of the coloring matter in an article of food is highly objectionable, and A fine of twenty shillings and costs was youths? imposed upon the defendant. 
