Our sister village, Canington, has prospered since incorporation and there is certainly no reason why we should not do the same.

BY-LAW No. 7, 1883.

Township of Thorah! County of Ontario.

BY-LAW to close part of the road known as the Cameron or Whitty road, and to provide for the sale of the same.

THE Corporation of the Municipality of Thorah enacts:

1st.—That from and after the final passing of this by-law all that portion of the road known as the Cameron or Whitty Road, lying between the south end of the Fromen Bridge, on the 1st Concession, and the southern limit of the allowance for road between the 3rd and 4th Concessions of the said Township, be, and the same is hereby closed up, and no longer used or considered a public highway of the said Township of Thorah.

2nd.—That the portions of the Cameron or Whitty Road, hereby closed, be sold to the proprietors of the adjacent lands for the sum, or at the rate of ten dollars per acre, provided, that if the proprietors of the adjacent lands shall not accept the conveyance, and complete the purchase of their several portions of the aforesaid road, within one year from the date of the passing of this by-law, then the Council may sell the portions not conveyed, to any other person, for the above or any greater sum or rate.

3rd.—That the Receiver, and is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Corporation, such deeds as may be requisite for carrying out the provisions of this by-law, all the expenses of conveying and purchasing to be paid by the parties interested.
