## Rules and Regulations.

1st.—All persons other than paid up members shall be charged \$2 for making entries, except in classes M and N, which shall

2nd .- All animals exhibited shall be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.

3rd .- All articles exhibited shall have been grown or manufactured by the exhibitor in 1879.

4th.-No animal shall be allowed to compete in more than one class, nor more than once in the same class.

5th.—The Judges in the several classes shall have the power to decide whether the animals or articles exhibited are worthy of prizes or not, and to award such grades of prizes as they shall see fit.

6th .- Parties exhibiting, not in accordance with the Rules and Regulations, shall forfeit all prizes awarded to them, and be excluded from the Society for two years.

7th.—No person shall make any more than one entry for the came variety, manufacture, grain, dairy produce, fruit or vege-

8th.—No prizes shall be paid on the day of show, but on and after Monday, the 13th day of October, and shall be sent by mail, when so desired by recipients, and at their expense.

9th.-Intending exhibitors shall take notice that the Book of Entries for the show shall be opened on the 1st, and closed on the 27th day of September, at 6 p. m.

Note. - Exhibitors will please bear in mind that no entries shall be received on day of Show upon any consideration. Lists of entries may be sent to the Secretary at Kirkfield by mail, and if so sent must be mailed in sufficient time to be received by him on the 27th September, or they will not be entered. Such lists must plainly state the Class and variety in which each entry is to be made.

10th. -All articles for the indoor department must be given in charge of the arranging committee by 10.30 a. m. on day of

11th. -All live stock must be placed agreeably to the directions of the committee by 10.30 a. m. on day of Show, and all Bulls so placed must be chained.

12th.-No exhibitor shall be allowed to remove any article before 4 p. m. on day of Show.

13th.—No owner of any thoroughbred animal shall be entitled to receive a premium unless a satisfactory pedigree be left with the Secretary at the time of entry.

14th.—Should any dispute arise in connection with any award the Treasurer shall hold the prize money until the matter is settled. The decision of the Directors in all cases shall be final.

15th .- The public shall be admitted to Show ground on presenting their tickets at gate; and to the show room without any extra charge, after the Judges shall have completed their inspection and made their award. The price of admission ticket shall be 10 cents, which can be purchased of the Treasurer, N. Heaslip, Esq., on the morning of show day.

16th .- All wheat taking the first prize may be sold by the Secretary, at not less than market price, and proceeds given to

17th.-No intoxicating liquors shall be allowed on the Show ground, nor within the distance prescribed by law. Gambling of every description shall also be strictly prohibited.
