

#### Arabi's Allies.

Anyone who desires to obtain an idea of the difficulties and dangers that will beset the British army in the coming Egyptian campaign should read the story of the French invasion of Egypt, under Napoleon, at the end of last century. The worst of the matter is, that the campaign is beginning at the most unhealthy season of the year. Egypt, travellers say, is as deadly in August as India in June. The horrors and sufferings of the French army were the same as the Crusaders under Louis 1X endured in the 13th century-a fact which shows that the climate of lower Egypt has changed as little as the people. Indeed the telegrams we publish every day giving accounts of native atrocities, are the same, save the quaintness of language, as the stories brought back by the survivors of the seventh crusade. The same dreadful story was repeated by those who followed Napoleon and served after he left under Kieber and Menou.

The hot wind of the desert, called by the natives Khamsin, is a realization of Tophet itself. No man can face it without instantly succumbing. It is infinitely worse than the Sirocco, of which those who have been any time in Malta will retain a withering memory. Before this wind the nervous system collapses, the muscles become nu-strung, the skin parches, a raging thirst sets mland then fever. Nor are the cities much to be regarded as refuges, for in them the plague is endemic, and always bursts out into an epidemic in times of war.

Native filth and religious fatalism breed

pestilence; the very flies are emissaries of death in its most agonizing and revolting form. In lower Egypt also Opth linia assumes an exceedinly virulent type. This affliction is almost zymotic as a dirt disease directly traceable to the unclean habits of the people. Among Europeans it is generated in a singular way. A small green fly persistently settles upon the sores of the diseased eyelid, and when driven off carries the infection along with it wherever it alights. So common is this disease among the Arabs that Mehemet Ali is said to have formed two battalions of one-eyed men, the one wanting the right eye and the other the left. In 1798 this complaint made great rayages in the army of Bonaparte, one of whose best officers, becoming quite blind in the desert, was forced to cling to the tail of a comrade's horse in order to make his way back to the camp.

Such are some of the enemies against which shot and shell are useless, that the British troops will have to face in Egypt.
Those who have had a taste of campaigning in the East will appreciate the dangers and trials in store for them, for no one who has not "been there," so to speak, can imagine the ineffable horrors of a summer campaign in the Orient.
