

MARIPOSA.

Council met 15th Sept., 1879. Members present. Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Moved by Mr. Broad, seconded by Mr. Lownsbrough, that this Council having heard the agreement and subscription signed by A. Horn, J. L. Whiteside, Elihu Rogers, and others, for removing the dam on Lot 20, Con. 12, approve of the same, and hereby instruct the Reeve to sign the same on behalf of this corporation, and attach the corporate seal thereto for the sum of four hundred and twenty-five dollars, to be paid in four annual instalments, according to the terms of said agreement; and that a by-law be prepared for the same.—Carried. Yeas Messrs. Broad, Lownsbrough and Adam; Nays—Messrs. Bowes and Mark.

Moved by Mr. Broad, seconded by Mr. Lownsbrough, that By-Law No. 243, being a by-law to appropriate the sum of \$450.00, in part compensation for removing the dam on Lot 20, in the 12th Con., be now read a first time.—Carried.

By-Law No. 243 after passing through committee, was read a third time and finally passed.

Moved by Mr. Broad, seconded by Mr. Mark, that By-Law No. 244, being a By-Law to amend By-Law No. 225 of the Township of Mariposa, be now read a first time.—Carried.

By-Law No. 244, after passing through committee, was read a second time and finally passed.

Moved by Mr. Bowes, seconded by Mr. Broad, that By-Law No. 245, being a By-Law to provide for appointing an Arbitration in a matter of drainage works in the Township of Mariposa and Eldon, be received and read a first time.—Carried.

By-Law 245 passed.

Moved by Mr. Lownsbrough, seconded by Mr. Mark, that this Council appoint Thomas Smith collector for the North half of this township, and Thomas Wallis collector for the south half, for the present year, at a salary of \$60 each.—Carried.

By-Law 446, for appointing Collectors, is introduced and passed.

Moved by Mr. Lownsbrough, seconded by Mr. Bowes, that the Clerk be instructed to notify Mr. Wm. James from off the road on the 10, opposite Lots 12 and 13.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bowes, seconded by Mr. Broad, that the Reeve give his order on the treasurer in favor of John Rodd, an indigent person, for the sum of \$2.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bowes, seconded by Mr. Broad, that the petition of A. Cameron and others, asking for the sum of \$20 to improve the water courses in Oakwood, be laid on the table for future consideration.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bowes, seconded by Mr. Broad, that the Clerk be instructed to notify the Trustees of School Section 8, asking them to refund the sum of \$17.97 at once, in the event of the same not being refunded by the 25th inst., the Reeve and Clerk be instructed to take legal proceedings to recover the same.—Carried.

Council adjourned to meet again on the 22nd Monday in October next.

GRAIN BUYERS' ASSOCIATION.

An adjourned meeting of Grain Buyers met at Lindsay, on the 16th inst., and formed an Association named the "Grain Buyers' Association," for the Lindsay, Port Perry, Cambridge, Woodville, Oakwood, Cannington and Fenelon Falls districts, at which the following resolutions were unanimously carried:—That all grain be bought by weight the Standard Weight to be Toronto Standard. For Spring and Fall Wheat 60 lbs. to the bushel; 59 lbs. 1 cent less than standard price; 58 lbs. 3 cents less; 57 lbs. 5 cents less; 56 lbs. 10 cents less; 55 lbs. 15 cents less; and 1 cent per lb. extra above standard weight. For Barley—Standard Weight 49 lbs.—48 lbs. 2 cents less than Toronto Standard price; 47 lbs. 6 cents less; 46 lbs. 10 cents less.

That 1 pound per 100 be deducted for handling; and that a copy of the above resolutions be posted in a conspicuous place in each buyer's warehouse.

That Mr. Geo. Currie be President of the Association, and Mr. Jas. A. Mitchell be Secretary-Treasurer; and that a copy of these resolutions be sent to the newspapers published in the districts above mentioned.
