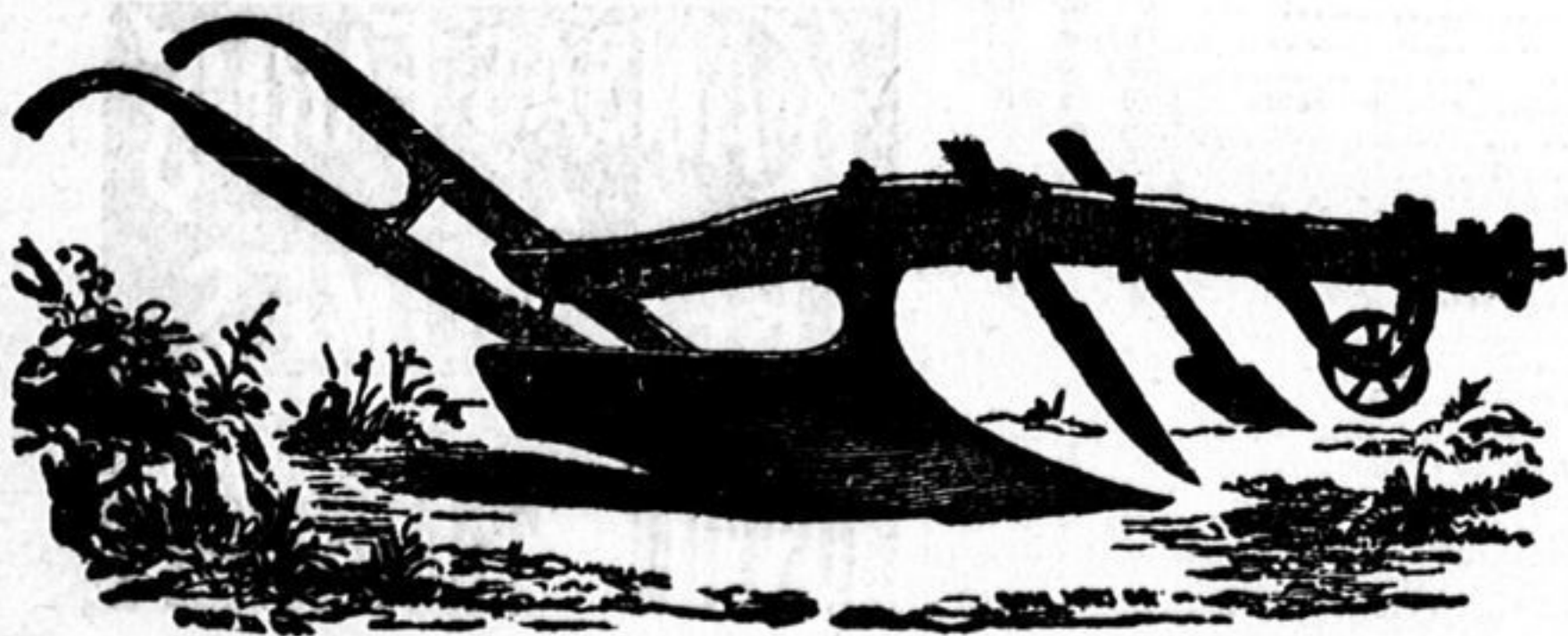

The Organ is of Solid Black Walnut, with heavy Hand Carved Trusses. The ends and Front Panels are raised and finished with French Walnut Stock, highly polished. It has beautiful Lamp Stands placed in a convenient and safe position for use.

There is a high Fancy Back attached, made and finished in harmony with the case, with a neat Vase Stand that adds very materially to the beauty of the same.

The Fall Board is the most simple and convenient of any in use. Any child can open and close it with ease. When open it forms a neat and convenient Rack for Music. These Falls are placed so that they cannot interfere with the musical qualities of the Organ.
