**Thorah Township Council.**

Council met at 1 p. m., on Saturday, October 1st. Members all present. Minutes of last council read and approved. Moved by Mr. Francis McRae, seconded by Mr. Donnell, that by-law No. 4, of 1887, to establish a deviation for the road on lot 6 in the 11th concession be now read the 2nd and third time and passed. By-law passed. Moved by Mr. Donnell, seconded by Mr. Fraser, that orders be filled in favor of the Sec-Treasurers of the school sections for the following amounts to be paid as soon as collected viz: Section 1, \$360; Section 2, \$342.85; Section 3, \$330.89; U. S., No. 4, \$464.25; Section 5, \$664.39. Carried. Moved by Mr. F. McRae, seconded by Mr. Fraser, that the road Commissioner for the north division of the township be instructed to expend the sum of \$22, the balance of the amount of the contract for the ditch between lots 5 and 6, 10th concession, in repairing and improving the said ditch and culverts connected therewith, to complete the filling of the approaches and plank the bent of the bridge at Buckler's and to clear the ditch on the road between the 8th and 9th concessions at lot 10. That the Commissioner of the south division be instructed to let a contract for chopping and clearing the allowance for road between lot 20 and 21 in the south half of the 1st concession and to grub and stump a track two rods wide on the centre of the said road, to examine and repair where necessary, the following bridges viz: between the 4th and 5th concessions at lot 7; centre road, 4th concession and at McCuaig's, to remove all flood wood and other material likely to injure the bridges in the spring, at all the bridges in his division and to examine the allowance for road between lots 15 and 16, south half concession 5, and if expedient expend \$20 in continuing the connection with the road on the north half of the said concession, and that Mr. Angus McKay, pathmaster, division 17 be instructed to have the necessary repairs made on the bridge between 3 and 4 concessions at lot 9. Carried. A number of accounts were presented and on motion by Mr. Donnell seconded by Mr. Frazier were ordered to be paid. Moved by Mr. Galloway, seconded by Mr. F. McRae, that the council do now adjourn until Saturday the 17th day of December, to meet at 1 o'clock, p. m.
