produces the barley and in the manufacture of beer, the brewer makes the beer, the manufacturer of brick furnishes the material for the construction of an hotel or a church and equally welcomes to his pockets the dimes from either source and the retailer disposes of the article, all are engaged in the transaction; punish one and the other should not escape. Destroy the barley and it leaves the barn to the loss of the farmer as well as the beer in the cellar; fine and jail the brickmaker as well as the retailer. Be consistant, be honest. Treat all equally or you might require the assistance of councel to keep you outside the wall of that prison you so strongly recommend to others. You then strike off in a heavenly strain and attempt to conceal your narrow views with the cloak of Scriptural phrases. Satan you know was an adept at Scriptural quotations to suit his purpose and could quote as glibly as you. You had better read the 23rd chapter of St. Matthews gospel and dwell especially on the 33rd verse. seems to me that language was not sufficiently strong to express Christ's hatred of this class, I mean the hypocrite or devotees of that new religion superceeding Christianity, referred to in an article published in the "Week" recently, in whose views the sin of selling drink is more heinous in the sight of Heaven than murder, &c. Your next strike is more personal—that I, or some one may be guilty of lawlessness, dynamite, I suppose. Doubtless you feel that your conduct is deserving of a coat of tar and feathers, it will at any rate, receive the contempt of the community. Remember my good friend, that you have been here only a short time, we cannot get into your ways so quick. Have patience.


