COUNCIL met this 5th day of December, 1881.

Members present, Messrs. Adam, Broad, Lownsbrough, and Bowes.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved. Moved by Mr. Bowes, seconded by Mr. Broad that W. Lownsbrough be authorized to procure such clothing for the Blew family as he may deem necessary for the winter. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Broad, seconded by Mr. Bowes, that the Reeve give his order on the Treasurer in favor of the following indigent persons: Duncan Carmichael, in care of T. Wallis, \$6.00; Blew family, in care of A. Cameron, \$5.00; John Edwards, \$2.00. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bowes, seconded by Mr. Lownsbrough, that the Reeve give his order on the Treasurer in favor of Thomas Wallis, for the sum of \$2.50 for repairing two sluiceways on the 6th Con. line, also William White for 75 cts. for repairing Bridge on 9th Con. line. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bowes, seconded by Mr. Broad that By-Law No. 277, being a By-Law to provide for Polling places and appointing Deputy Returning Officers to hold the Municipal Election in the Township of Mariposa for year A. D., 1882, be received and read a first time. Carried.

By-Law No 277, after passing through Committee was read a third time and finally passed.

Moved by Mr. Broad, seconded by Mr. Lownsbrough, that this council authorize the Clerk to notify the parties occupying the road allowance between Lots 15 and 16 in the second Concession, that this council will at its next sitting take into consideration the propriety of opening said road. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bowes, seconded by Mr. Broad, that the Reeve give his orders on the Treasurer for the following sums: in favor of C. D. Barr for printing and advertising under School By-Law No. 274, \$8.50; H. Dunsford, registering By-law, \$3.00; Clerk's expenses drawing By-law, &c., \$5.00; also C. D. Barr for printing and advertising under School By-law 273, \$3.50; H. Dunsford registering By-law, \$3.00; Clerk's expenses drawing By Law, &c., \$4.00; the above items to be paid out of the Debit-accounts for School Sections 16 and 14. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Bowes, seconded by Mr. Lownsbrough, that the following accounts be paid and that the Reeve give his orders on the Treasurer for the same: D. C. Howard, repairs at Town Hall, \$3.95; C. D. Barr, printing accounts, \$7.75; C. V. Ham, registering lease of gravel pit, \$1.40; Hart & Co., per account, \$3.14. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Lownsbrough, seconded by Mr. Bowes, that the Reeve give his orders on the Treasurer in favor of the Secretary Treasurers of the Public School Sections in the Township of Mariposa for the following sums, being amounts raised for Public Schools for the year 1881:—Section No 1, \$280.00; No. 2, \$240.00; No. 5, \$370.00; No. 6, \$270.00; No. 7, \$360.00; No. 8, \$375.00; No. 9, \$385.00; No. 10, 270.00; No. 11, \$320.00; No. 12, \$500.00; No. 13, \$316.00; No. 14, \$300.00; No. 15, \$330.00; No. 16, \$240.00; No. 17, \$330.00; No. 18, \$300.00; No. 19, \$180.00; Union School Section No. 1, \$252.90; No. 2, \$61.54; No. 3, \$357.03; No. 4, 133.43; No. 17, \$111.10; Mariposa High School, \$300.00. WE have received a copy of the *La Porte City Review* containing the obituary notice of an old resident of Woodville, Mr. Arch. McPhayden. To our old residents Mr. McPhayden will be well known, having served his apprenticeship with the late Alex. Stuart, in Woodville. Leaving here he wandered through various parts of the States, finally settling in La Porte City, Iowa, in 1872. The following is clipped from the *Review*:—"The first inevitable law of nature is, all must die. Death has been a victor, but he has been conquered; he may bring rest, but he leaves labor; he may bring everlasting joy, but he leaves sorrow; he may be a welcome guest to some, others fear and dread him. But he has no respect to persons. He is the messenger of God, by which he takes off man's mortality, and puts on his immortality. The messenger called Archie McPhayden to his everlasting home Nov. 15th. Death was an unwelcome guest in that otherwise happy home, for it was to take father—to leave orphans and a widow. To him it may be gain, but to them it is a great loss. To him it brings everlasting rest, to them labor. To him it may bring joy, to them it brings sorrow. Archie McPhayden was a good man, and as such, the town mourns the loss; but others will take his place. He was a good father, no one can ever take his place. In the family circle his chair is vacant, never to be filled. Some one may sit in the chair, but not as the grand link of the great chain that encircles the family circle. He was at the head of the temperance cause, and few can fill his place. In that cause he won the grandest victory ever won—conquered himself. He was born in Canada, and moved to Iowa in 1872. He was 45 years, 11 months and 15 days of age. He leaves a widow, six children, the temperance society and his acquaintances to mourn his departure. He was a hard worker, and no doubt the cause of his death was the work done in the late fire. He was Assistant Foreman, and the Company had not help enough that night. He was never well afterwards. The Fire Company paid great respect to the remains of a good member. They attended his funeral in a body, accompanied by the Cornet Band. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. W. A. Pottle, at the M. E. church. There was a very large congregation present—seldom we see larger ones in this section, and very seldom we hear a more able funeral sermon preached than the one on that occasion.

A HANDSOME new passenger coach will be added to the T. & N. R. R. local train after the new year.
