**Editorial Notes.**

THE "Globe" says the Ontario Legislature will probably meet on the 24th of January.

THE Scott Act association has been revived in Wellington county to organize an anti-repeal campaign.

A meeting is to be held in London England next month for the purpose of forming a general committee to act with reference to the proposed Eucumenical council of Methodists throughout the world which is to be held in this country.

In spite of the great tariff fight between Republicans and the Democrats of the United States, the young, vigorous and determined prohibition party comes up smiling with nearly 350,000 votes. St. John polled 150,000 in the last preceding presidential contest. The prohibition party must be reckoned with.

It is prophesied that President Harrison will try to force the Fisheries Treaty through the Senate. While this treaty is equitable and fair to Canada, its passage benefits the United States more than it does us. We are a peculiar people—satisfied with the treaty of 1888.

It has been calculated in the United States, and it has not been disputed, that the Presidential election cost directly and indirectly not less than \$500,000,000, that is, at the rate of \$125,000,000 a year for the Presidential period. Thus the mere cost of choosing a ruler in the neighboring Republic is several times greater than our whole public expenditure, the Governor-General's salary and expenses included.

PRESIDENT CLEVELAND is still in the prime of life. He will leave the White House at least \$75,000 richer than when he entered it. This added to his other investments, ought to give him a comfortable fortune of upwards of \$200,000. Moreover through the division of the Folsom estate in Omaha, Mrs. Cleveland is an heiress in her own right and is probably worth not less than \$500,000. Both Mr. and Mrs. Cleveland would prefer a few years of foreign travel as a pleasant rounding off of their White House experience before settling down to the quiet of every day life and for this reason a European trip is regarded as among the strong probabilities.

We learn from a reliable source that the recent petition to repeal the Scott Act in the County of Ontario has been pronounced illegal, or rather "irregular" and that it will necessitate the canvass of the county again at a considerable cost. Why did not those interested in this petition place it elsewhere than in the bar-rooms of the County. During the circulation of the document we did not hear of its presence among us until it had been sent away. Why do the Anti-Scott act party, hide this petition within their own ranks. If there is such dissatisfaction with the Act among those who favored it before, as they would have us believe why not ask them to petition for its repeal. Surely they are, as likely, if the act is as bad as claimed, to desire its repeal. We would like to hear their voice in the matter.

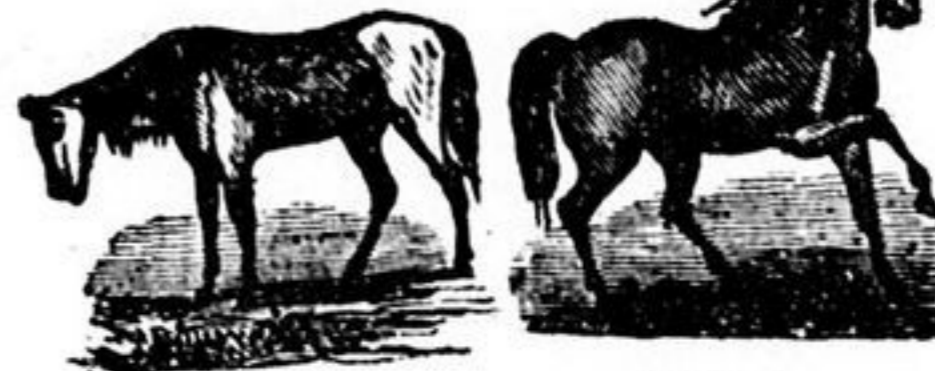
