Public Library Board

A short meeting of the Public Library Board was held last Friday evening. There were present Judge Harding, Dr. Blanchard, and Messrs. Hardy, Moore and Broderick. The business was largely routine. The annual reports of the Library and Reading Room committee of the Board, and of the treasurer were read and will be given in a later issue. A large number of new books were passed. Mr. John Keiley was appointed to check the books in the library. It was decided to print the annual report. The total circulation for the year was 16,823. There were 989 borrowers from the library on Dec. 31st, 1900. The sum of \$264.72 was spent in books last year, \$72.13 in fiction and \$192.59 on non-fiction. All accounts are paid but a balance of \$50 in rent, while the Treasurer has \$12.70 on hand. The total assets of the library are \$3512.70 and the liabilities \$350.00. There are 2,366 books in the library 266 of which were added last year by purchase and 97 volumes, valued at \$10 were donated.
