It would have been money in my pocket to have them sold, as I would have had the cost of transfers, etc., and why any ratepayer should object to any transaction so beneficial to the town is beyond my comprehension. Were the council tomorrow to lend part of the Sinking Fund on a town property, that would not disqualify them, and this is all that transaction amounted to. The only thing done by the council of 1901 was to pass a resolution on August 19th, which is verbatim as follows:

All that the If you can't make a resolution says is that a certain sum of \$1,127.04, made up of \$116.24 of cash on hand, and \$960.80 received from Water Commissioners, be set apart as a Park Fund. This appears to me to be quite proper. Certain mortgages belonging to the Park Fund had been disposed of by the council of 1900 and loaned to the Water Commissioners. When the amount was repaid by the Water Commissioners it was quite proper to put it back in the Park Fund. The resolution in no way authorizes the taking of any money from the Sinking Fund. That had been done long before under the by-law passed in December, 1900, and no authority for it was required, and if there was the resolution does not profess to give it, but only recites that it had been done, shewing the reason for putting the money received from the Water Commissioners to the Park Fund. And as it is only by voting for a diversion of the funds that disqualifies, I do not see how a councillor can be held, by voting for a resolution, to have voted for something which the resolution not only does not, but does not profess to authorize.

THE FINDING To sum up, the Collegiate Institute Sinking Fund is intact, not a dollar has been diverted therefrom, and no councillor that I can find ever (in the words of the statute) voted for diverting any part of it for current or other expenditure. The council of 1900 authorized the investing of \$960.80 in certain mortgages supposied to belong to the Park Fund, and the payment of the proceeds to the Water Commissioners. And when the Water Commissioners returned the same in 1901 the council directed that amount be placed burk to the eredit of the Park Fund where it is to-day, less the amount spent for park purposes. The town, instead of suffering any loss, have gained by having part of the Collegiate Institute Sinking Fund at 6 per cent. instead of deposited in the Bank at 3 per cent. If any person doubts that these mortgages are good, and thinks that there is danger of loss to the Sinking Fund, I shall be glad of the
