TORONTO LIVE STOCK.

Receipts of live stock at the city market, as reported by the railways, were 32 car loads, composed of 225 cattle, 169 hogs, 509 sheep and 17 calves.

Exporters.

Only a very few export cattle were on sale, and prices ranged from \$4 to \$4.50. Export bulls sold from \$3.50 to \$4.

Butchers.

The best butcher sold from \$4 to \$4.25; fair to good, \$3.75 to \$4; medium, \$3.50 to \$3.75; common to good, \$3.25 to \$3.50; to \$3.75; canners at \$1.50 per cwt.

Feeders and Stockers.

A limited number of feeders and stockers sold as follows: feeders, 1000 to 1100 lbs. were reported as selling from \$3.00 to \$3.40; feeders, 800 to 900 lbs., \$3.25 to \$3.50; stockers ranged from \$2.50 for common to \$3.50 for good; short-keep feeders, 1100 to 1200 lbs., are worth \$3.80 to \$4 per cwt.

Milk Cows.

About 10 milk cows and springers sold from \$34 to \$53 each.

Veal Calves.

Veal calves are worth from \$4 to \$6.25 per cwt.

Sheep and Lambs.

Prices were firm at \$4 to \$4.50 for export ewes; lambs at \$3.50 to \$2.10 and choice ewes and wethers were worth \$6.25 per cwt.

Hogs.

Prices were quoted by Mr. Harris as unchanged, at \$5.10 for select and \$5.85 for lights and fats.

Skater Drowned in Bay of Quinte.

Bellefleur, Jan. 3.—Ernest Coughlin, a 12-year-old boy of this city, was drowned in the Bay of Quinte Monday. He was out skating on the bay, and was using a sail which carried him along at great speed. When last seen he was making the Prince Edward shore, on the edges of which there was much open water. The body was recovered yesterday.

Winnipeg Bank Clerk Suicides.

Winnipeg, Jan. 2.—Robert George McCosh, a clerk at the Bank of Commerce, committed suicide by shooting himself yesterday morning. His accounts are straight at the bank, and despondency is said to be the cause. He was thirty-one years of age, and a son of Rev. Mr. McCosh of Chatham.

Komoka, Jan. 3.—While walking on the G. T. R. track, one mile west of the depot here Monday evening, Henry Smith of Bryon, Ont., was struck and killed by a train.
