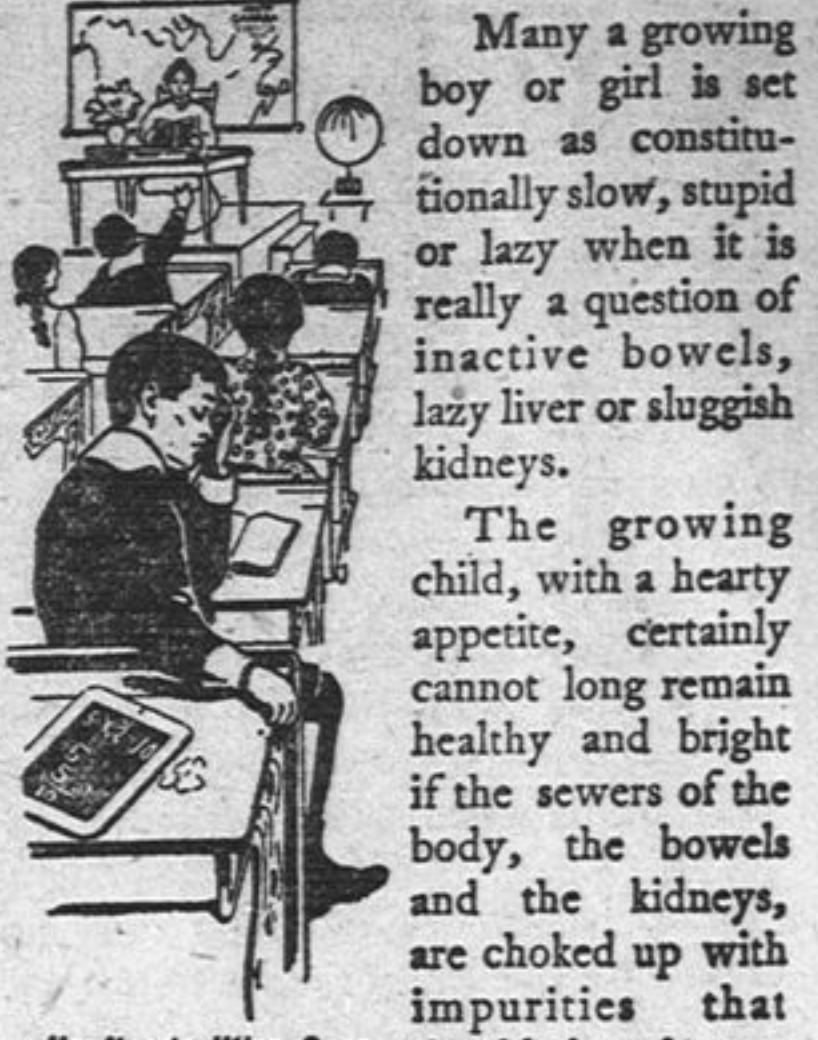

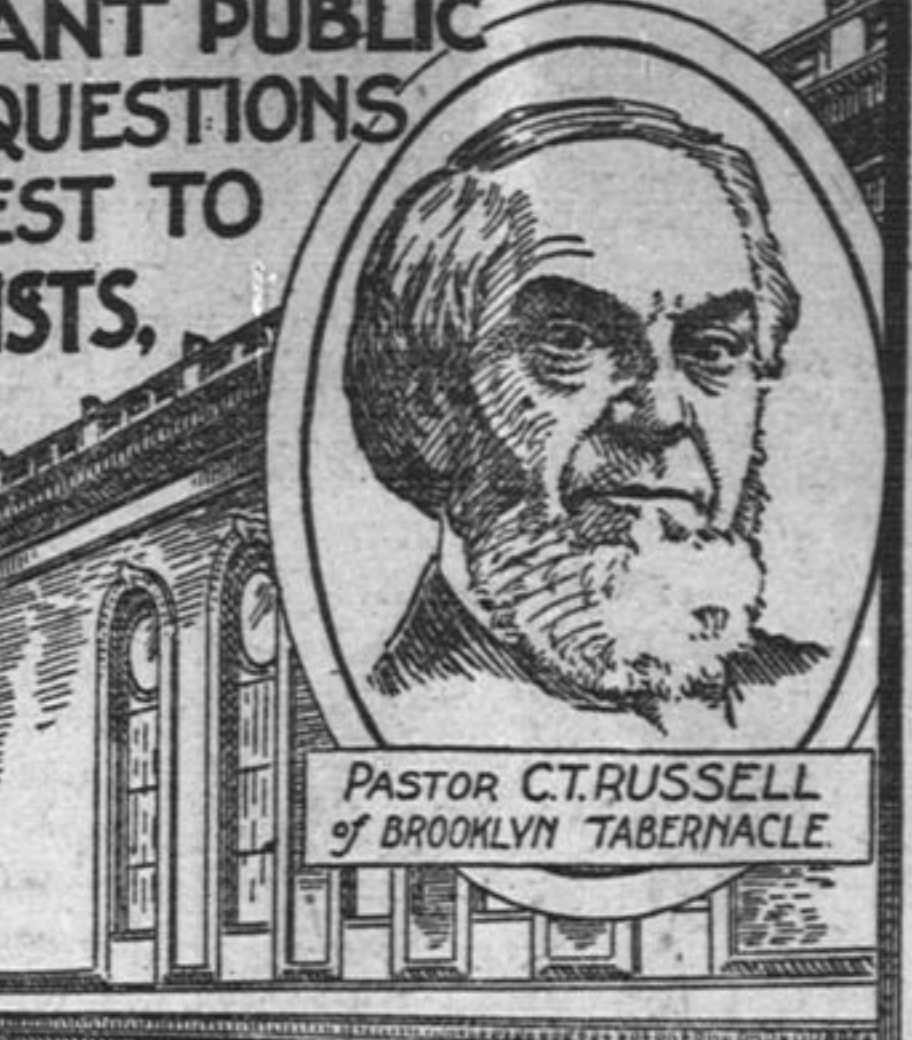

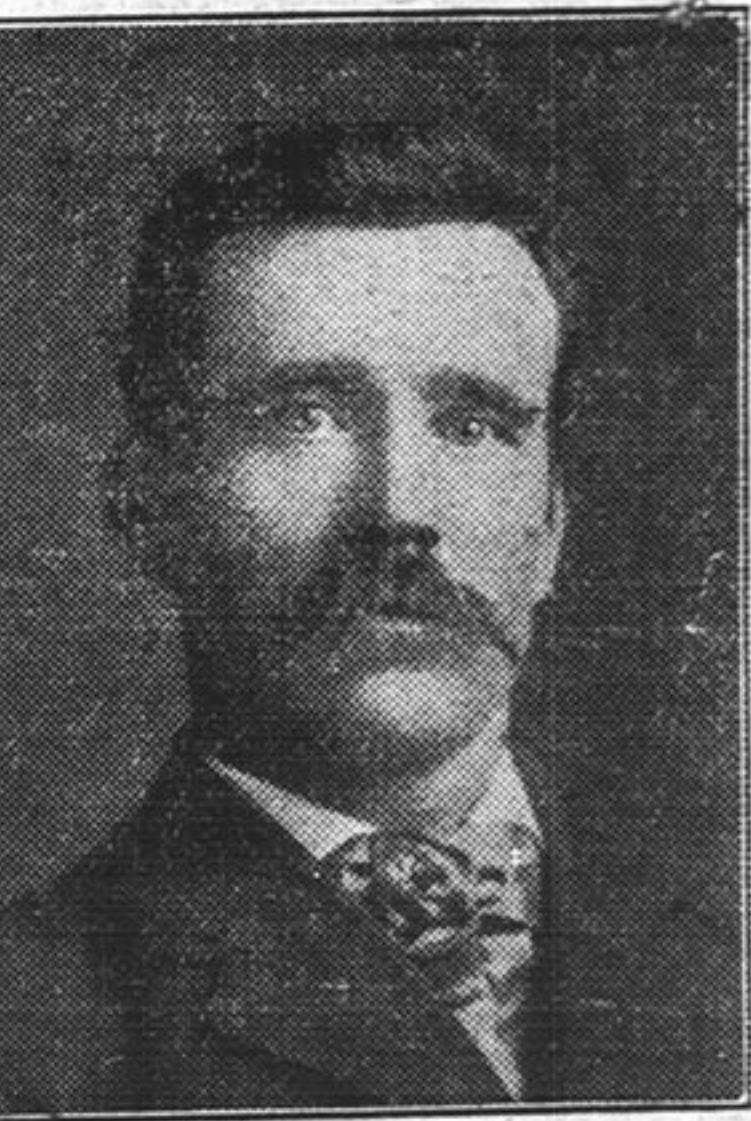

PETER HAWKINS, REEVE OF OPS.

Mr. Peter Hawkins, the popular reeve of Ops, is serving his second term in that position. In 1909, he was elected over W. H. Wilson by one vote after a close contest. At the recent municipal elections he defeated Jos. Best by a handsome majority.

Mr. Hawkins is a life-long resident of Ops, having been born on the farm where he now lives, lot 8, con. 8, near Keaboro. His municipal experience dates from 1900 when he was elected a member of the township council. Since then he has served seven years in the council, five as councillor. He is a successful farmer and takes a whole-souled interest in the welfare of his native township. As a councillor he is shrewd and business-like and as a man generous and good-natured.

His election in 1909 was a close one. The vote when first counted made him a tie with his opponent, and the clerk casting the deciding vote for the other man. Mr. Hawkins then demanded a recount and as a consequence was found to have been elected by a narrow majority.
