The National Union of Woman's Suffrage Associations of Canada is conducting a campaign for pensions for mothers as a result of the war.
Lady Jellicoe, wife of the head of the British navy, has established a temporary hall for women in the Hammondsmith road section of London.
Mrs. Charles S. Whitman, wife of the governor-elect of New York, is an ardent suffragist and is doing all she can to assist in its educational propaganda.
