Tuesday Evening, Feb. 24. Liverpool wheat futures closed 1/4 higher to-day than on Monday and corn futures 1/4 to 1/2 lower. At Chicago May wheat closed 1/2 below Saturday. May corn 1/2 lower and oats 1/2 lower.

THE VISIBLE SUPPLY.
As compared with a week ago, the visible supply of wheat in Canada and the United States has decreased 16,000 bushels; corn decreased 900 bushels; oats increased 83,000 bushels. Following is a comparative statement for the week ending to-day, the preceding week and the corresponding week of last year.
