COAL STRIKE IN THE AIR. HOST OF MINERS MAY WALK OUT ON APRIL FIRST. With prospects pointing to a strike of 550,000 coal miners unless the unforeseen influence, the national present deadlock is broken by some unforeseen influence, the national convention of the United Mine Workers of America adjourned last Friday afternoon, without reaching a settlement of a wage scale at the joint conference of the operators and miners of the central and southwestern districts. President John Mitchell of the Miners' Union advised the delegates to go home and look to the securing of a defence fund in view of a possible industrial strike between miners and operators, the miners having refused to renew the present wage scale, and the operators having refused to grant an increase in wages.

ECLIPSE OF THE MOON. TOTAL ECLIPSE WILL BE OBSERVED TO-MORROW MORNING. In the early morning of February 9th, the people of Lindsay and district will have an opportunity of witnessing a total eclipse of the moon, which will be visible throughout the United States and Canada. The moon will enter the earth's shadow and the eclipse will begin at three minutes before 1 a.m., eastern standard time; the eclipse will be complete total for one hour and four minutes, at the end of which time the moon will begin to emerge from the shadow, the eclipse ending at thirty-seven minutes past 4.
