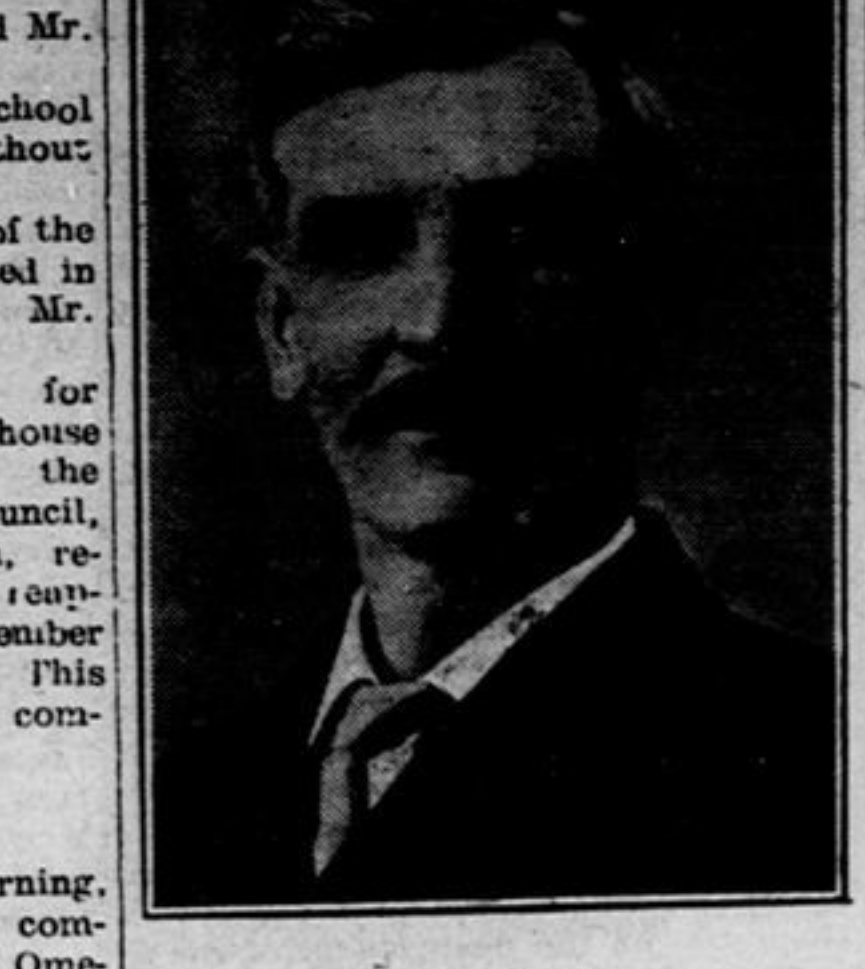

The question of giving grants to the agricultural societies in Victoria County was discussed at the meeting of the county council on Friday afternoon by Reeves Michael and Sims, who maintained that the outside societies were a benefit to the municipalities in that the people could not bring their stock to the county fairs.

Coun. Southern stated that the drop in North Victoria fair was being noticed in the quality of stock whereas the people could purchase good stock at that fair.

Reeve Devitt was heard in connection with the Bobcaygeon fair and winter seed judging. The society is progressing because the heads of it are progressing.
