STANDARD FOR MILK

First Deputy-Reeve Lewis is in the right when he stated that there should be an inspector of milk and of dairies in Lindsay. Milk is a food, and as he stated, is pure and free from the cow, but is often "doctorbefore reaching the consumer. Tests have been made in Lindsay and they have not always been satisfactory. A new Provincial milk bil will shortly be introduced to the Legislature, being now in course preparation. The basis of the bill will be authority granted ta each municipality to trace all milk sold within its limits to the source supply and to insist on certain standards of cleanliness in the stable and handling of milk before it reaches the consumer,

I'ower will also be given to any municipal inspector to refuse admission of the milk until the regulations are complied with. The enforcement of the terms of the bill will be left to the municipalities. The appointment of an inspector will be in no sense compulsory, nor will a Provincial standard be fixed wither for butfat nor the solids, although 3 and 12 per cent., it is understood, will be recommended. There will, consequently be no Provincial inspectors. The Government will provide the machinery for the municipality, and they must operate it.


IS AN IMITATION COUGH MEDI- The Cooking and Serving of the Winter Apple.

FOR SUNDAY NIGHT SUPPER.

It's Hard to Invent a Novelty For Cheese Course, but Here's One That Will About Fill the Bill With Little more do you want imitations Trouble or Expense.

In many homes apple sauce and apples baked are the only ways of serving this abundant fruit, but there are a number of other styles that will be found quite as appetizing. The following recipes are all tried and trusty a temptation to imitators.

Stuffed Apple Compote.-Pare a dozen fine large apples and carefully re-



orange or peach marmalade and put them into an agate or earthen ware baking dish with a pound of granulated sugar, half a cupful of water and a dusting of ground cinnamon or grated nutmeg. Let them bake in a moderately hot oven until they are tender. Serve hot or cold. Fried Apples.-Juicy rather tart ap-

ples are best for this purpose. Pare the apples and cut them in round slices and fry them a nice brown in deep hot fat. Drain them in a heated colander and then place them in dish, sprinkle with sugar and serve with roast pork.

Baked Apple Pudding .- Stew enough apples to make a pint of sauce and while the apples are beiling het stir in a tablespeenful of butter and nutmeg, mace, cinnamon and alispice to suit the taste. Then take from the fire two or three eggs. Beat all very light

cold water and half a lemon and co ground cinnamon and half a cupful good brandy. Set back on the stoy and let the juice boil for five minutes.

This salmon recipe is excellent for Hot Canned Salmon.—Set a can of salmon in a saucepan of boiling water over the fire and let the water simmer afteen or twenty minutes. Open the san close to the edge, drain off the figuid, then turn the salmon on to the

center of a serving dish. Surround with potatoes cut in lengthwise quarters or in balls cooked tender and drained. Garnish with a hard cooked egg cut in quarters. Serve egg sauce in a sauce boat. Egg Sauce.-Melt two tablespoonfuls of butter, in it cook two tablespoonfuls

of flour and one-fourth a teaspoonful of salt and add one cupful of cold water and stir until boiling. Draw to a



cooler part of the range and gradually stir in two tablespoonfuls of butter cut in small pieces. Finish with a hard cooked egg chopped fine or cut in slices. Here's just the thing for a novel cheese course. Roll cream cheese into balls nearly an inch in diameter and roll the balls in pistachio nuts blanched and chopped. Pile the balls in a wreath of orange or grapefruit marmalade. Surround the marmalade with hot toasted crackers. Serve at the close of luncheon or dinner in the place of the usual pudding, ple or other sweet dish. If preferred pass the cheese, marmalade and crackers on tray in separate receptacles,
