\$200,000. FIRE.

Hamilton, Ont., Feb. 5. — Fire which broke out at 8.30 this morning in the Litho and Printing Plant of the Robert Duncan Co., in the rear of their stores at the corner of York and James-sts., gutted the three storey building within less than half an hour. A few minutes

delay in turning in an alarm and the fact that the hydrants were frozen, gave the blaze a big start, and the entire building as a consequence was a roaring furnace before the firemen could get enough pressure to check the fire.

Mr. Cochrane returned late last evening after a drive of over fifty miles, of fruitless searching and he is now going to adopt some other means of capturing the pair.

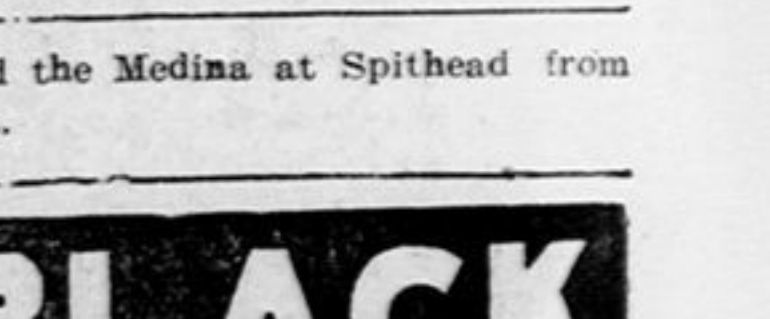
