



New Ways to Use Cranberries. For strained cranberry sauce boil a quart of cranberries in two cupfuls of water until they are tender. Then strain them through a colander to remove the skins, return to the fire, add a pound of granulated sugar, boil for five minutes and turn into molds. For cranberry jelly boil two quarts

of cranberries in a quart of water untill they are tender and then strain them through a bag. Heat the juice and add to each pint of it a pound of granulated sugar (three-quarters of a pound may be used if a tart jelly is wanted). Stir until the sugar is dissolved, but do not boit. Turn into jelly glasses or molds. Preserved cranberries are a conven-

ience when a little sauce is wanted ing," I replied, "And those fellows and the fresh fruit is not at hand. Little Three cupfuls of water are needed for each quart of fruit and a pound of sugar. Heat the sugar in the water and as soon as it boils turn in the berries. Cook until the skins crack-no longer; take out the fruit with a skimmer and turn into a jar. Boil the juice for four minutes longer, turn it over the berries and seal.

A delicious shortcake may be made with the usual biscuit or cake foundation and any cranberry sauce. The one in which the fruit is whole makes the most sightly cake. Cranberry pie with raisins is one of

the holiday pastries on Cape Cod. Fill a crust with a cupful of raw cranberexpress ries, half a cupful of seeded raisins, spoonful of vanilla. Strap or cover it and bake slowly.
