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



Dr. Nesbitt Dies Freed of Charges

Toronto, Feb. 1 .- An hour and half after the five indictments against him had been quashed by Mr. Justice Middleton, Dr. William Beattie Nesbitt died at his home, 71 Grosvenor street, at 3.38 yesterday afternoon of heart failure and Bright's disease in his forty-eighth year.

Mr. H. H. Dewart, K.C., counsel for Dr. Nesbitt, secured an appointment with the Judge for 2 o'clock to hear his argument. Mr. W. G. Thurston, K.C., was present on be half of the Crown. The argument was brief, his Lordship deciding in favor of Mr. Dewart's contention that the charges of making fraudulent returns to the Government as President of the Farmers Bank, upon which Dr. Nesbitt was extradited from Chicago, were not cited in the criminal code. Mr. Justice Middleton then gave judgment quashing the indictments; his reason, he said, would be given later.


