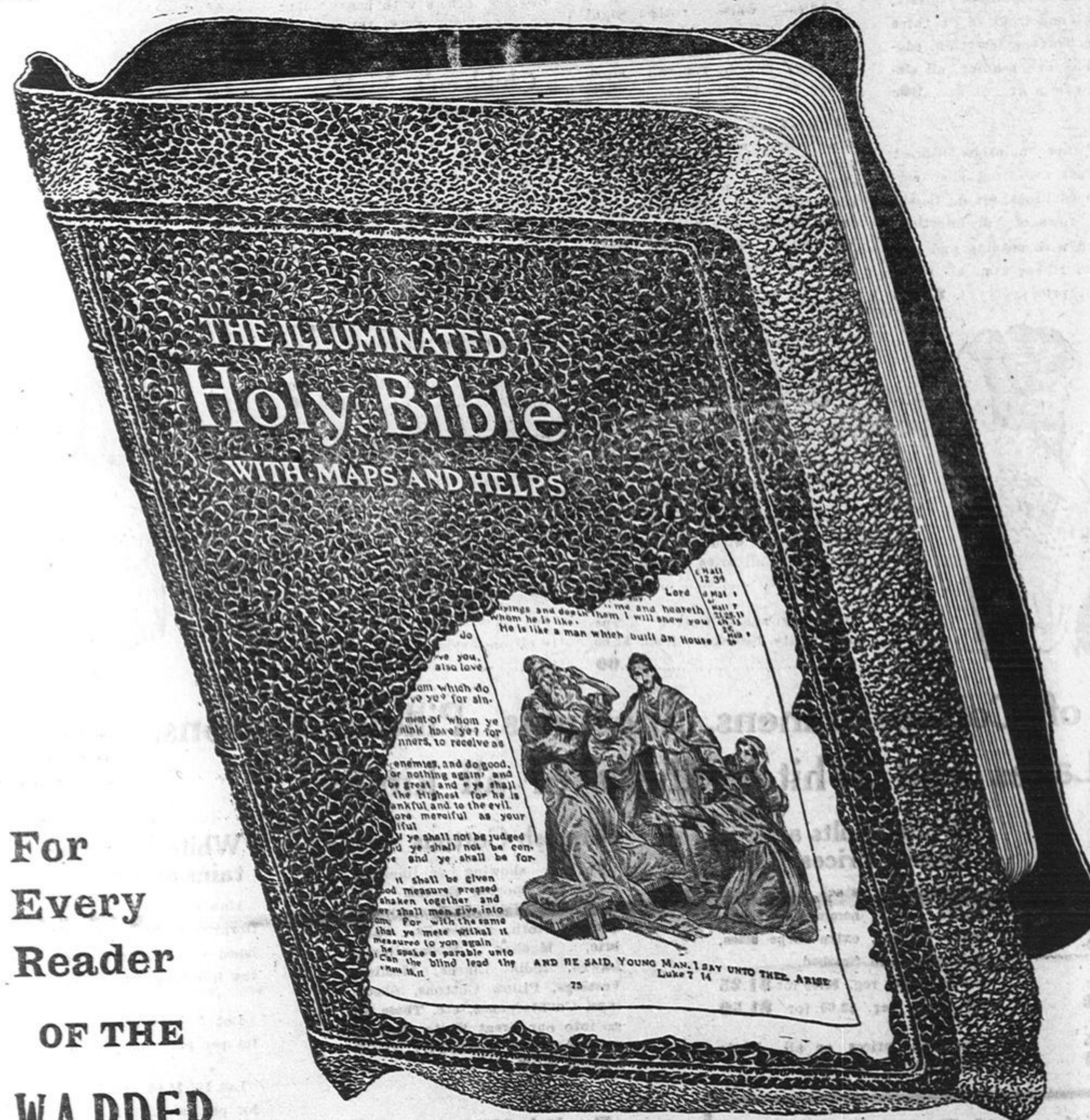

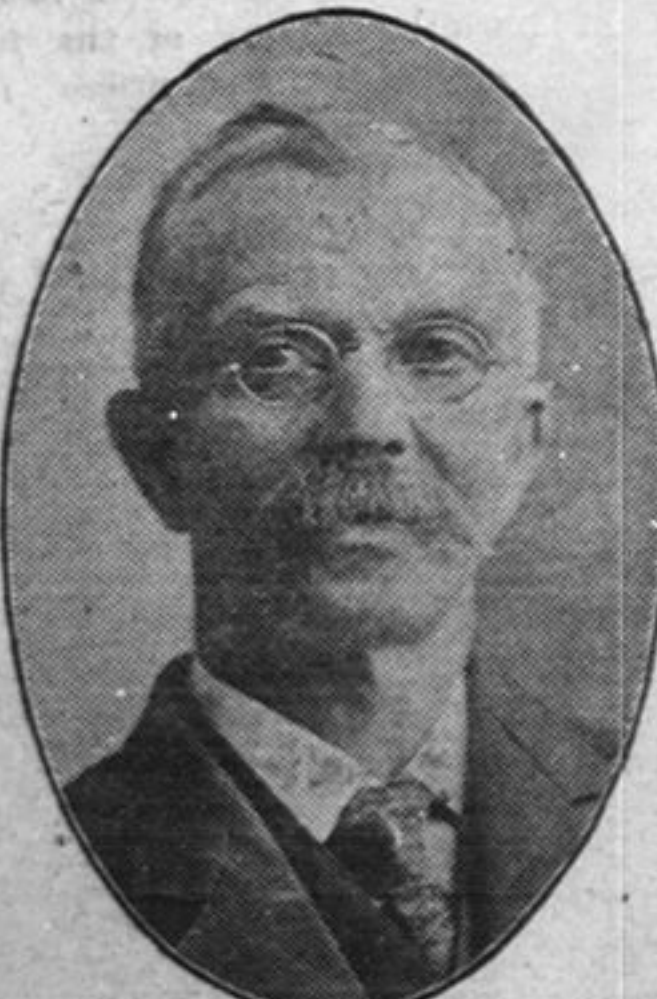

Dominion Bank Annual

The forty-second annual statement of the Dominion Bank covering the year ended the 31st December, 1912, is the best ever issued by the Bank. The net profits for the year amounted to over \$901,000, or a gain of nearly \$200,000 in the earnings for the previous year. The Bank had a total of \$1,608,000 available for distribution, made up of \$500,000 carried forward from 1911, net profits of \$901,000 and a premium on new stocks at the rate of 12 per cent., absorbed \$588,000, and a bonus of 2 per cent. \$100,000. The Officers' Pension Fund took \$25,000, and the Reserve Fund \$297,000, leaving \$688,000 to be carried forward. The cash and quickly available assets are shown as being 48.58 per cent. of the total liabilities to the public. During the year the Bank increased its paid-up capital, which now stands at \$5,000,000; its reserve fund being \$6,000,000. It also made the large gain of \$9,000,000 in total assets, which now stand at over \$79,000,000. Its circulation increased by \$600,000 and its deposits which now total nearly \$60,000,000 show an increase of \$5,800,000. In fact every department of the Bank showed satisfactory progress, and the statement must be regarded as a highly satisfactory one, not only to the management, but to the shareholders as well.
