Cadet Movement as the Agency for Good

Napanee, Feb. 2.—To make the youth of Canada self-controlled, erect and decent and patriotic, through military and physical training, instead of growing up, as under present conditions of uncontrolled gadding night about town or city streets, into young ruffians or young gad-about; to insure peace by a national preparedness for war; to make the military camps and drill halls throughout Canada clean, wholesome and sober and attractive to the boys and young men of the Dominion; to give the final touch to Imperial unity and crown the arch of responsibility and crown the arch of responsible government by an inter-Imperial Parliament, dealing only with Imperial affairs, these are among the ideals of Col. the Hon. Sam Hughes, Minister of Militia, as expressed to large Napanee audiences Friday and again Saturday afternoon at Picton. The energetic head of the Militia Department spent a busy afternoon and evening here on Friday, and again at Picton and Trenton on Saturday. He inspected a site offered by Napanee for a new and commodious drill-hall adjacent to the Town Hall, promised a public meeting of the citizens that the drill-hall would be provided, and later in the evening "occupied the pulpit" of the Methodist Church and addressed the audience under the auspices of the Imperial Order of Daughters of the Empire, a large gathering on military and patriotic subjects. From Napanee he went to Picton, where he addressed six hundred at the annual meeting of the Citizens' Association.

At present much rivalry is being displayed over this innovation. Under the leadership of Col. Hopkins the 45th Victoria regiment will assuredly keep in the front ranks.
