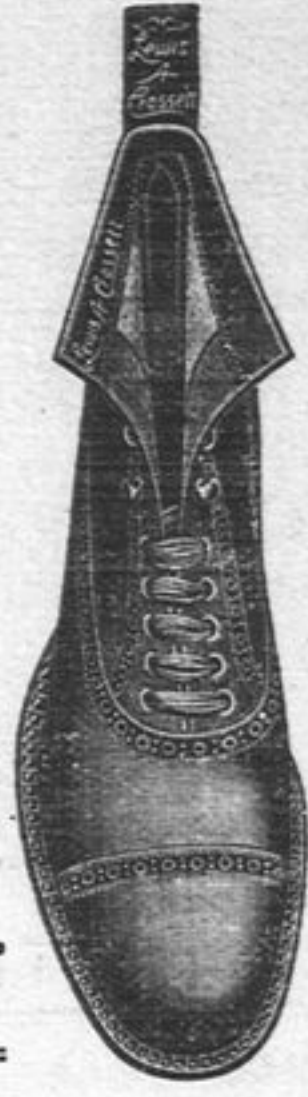

THE BREWERY WAS BURNED

Bad Fire Occurred Early Tuesday Morning

WAS LIKELY SET ON FIRE

Mr. Fred Cornell Has About \$2000 Insurance on a \$5000 Loss

About 4.15 on Tuesday morning some people living in the vicinity were roused by the red glare of the flames shooting up from the roof of the Victoria Spring Brewery. By the time an alarm could be sent in, and the firemen reach the spot, the building was beyond saving. The loss on building, plant and stock is placed at from \$4000 to \$5000, on which there was \$2,500 insurance.

The origin of the fire is unknown, but it appears to have been incendiary. Mr. Cornell, the proprietor, was in the office with a friend till 10.30, and when they left the stove fire had gone out. There had been no fire in the boiler for a couple of days. The fire burned unnoted for some time, and Mr. Cornell was not called until the fire had done its work.

The loss will be a very severe one for Mr. Cornell, who had good prospects for making the business a success. His knowledge of the business, and the attention he gave it, had enabled him to produce an ale that had become very popular. He had recently expended about \$1500 in improvements. He hopes to make arrangements to build again. The work of the fire brigade has been severely criticized. It seems to have reached the fire with insufficient hose and returned with more half an hour after the alarm was given.

The Weather For April

Prof. Hicks, in Word and Works for April, professes to have saved an enormous loss of cattle in the Western States by his forecast of the severe weather in the middle of February. Here is an outline of his prophecy for April:

Warm, humid weather with thunder storm opens the month. After the 4th snow squalls are due for some days. Very warm weather follows, especially in the west. Then comes rain, with hail, thunder and wind, on or about the 8th to 11th. These will bring in a decidedly cold wave with snow, sleet, and high winds. But again April showers and mild weather come in. Dashes of hail out of thunder clouds are to be expected any time. About the 17th warm weather will presage storms of great energy. However, it will not be surprising in this storm period there are three distinct sorts of weather at the same time in different places; warm and fair east of the storm area, rain or snow in the central parts, and clearing and colder in western and northern parts. Fine weather follows till after the 20th. Another storm period is central on the 24th and 25th. Heavy thunder storms are almost sure till after the 27th, when frosts are promised. The month closes warm.

Rev. Dr. Wild has received two invitations to become pastor of American churches, one of which pays about \$10,000 a year.

Coal strikers at Fernie, B. C., drove other workmen from the mines at the pistol's point, and assaulted the superintendent and his wife.

John Douglas, an engineer on a switch engine, that ran into another engine at London, Ont., on Thursday night, had both legs cut off. He died.

St. Stephen's Cathedral, Vienna, Austria, was robbed of jewels that embellished a venerable painting above the altar. The stolen gems are valued at \$10,000.

Whittaker Wright, the promoter of the huge English financial concern, called the London and Globe Company, that failed recently for many millions, was last week arrested in New York and refused bail.

The Pekin court will visit the western tombs on April 5th, and gorgeous pageantry will mark the affair. There will be 9,000 persons in the party, exclusive of the troops who will guard the 80 miles of railway.

Otto Peterson, of Brooklyn, intends to go across Niagara Falls, hanging by his teeth from a leather strap, connected with a three-quarter-inch wire, while suspended from his body he carries a man of his own weight—130 pounds.

The Toronto authorities are looking for De Jough, the Boer officer, who surrendered to Col. Hughes in Africa, and recently came to Toronto. He is charged with fraud at Midland, and of passing a bogus cheque for \$55 on the Walker House, Toronto.

A steer, in Toronto escaped the man leading him to the market. He rushed madly up Yonge-st. and along College, putting one lad up into the air, and plenty of other people into doorways and behind poles. He was caught by a fireman and 4 street railway men.

A hook recently published in England, tells of revolting tales of cruelty practiced on natives in the Congo State by a Belgian company operating there. The book was written by two officers, who say they can prove all it says and more. Its sale has been forbidden.

On Saturday an ice jam in Niagara River diverted the water from the American fall, and people walked out into the bed of the river above it. Where for ages the great torrent had poured down, the naked rocks on the face and at the foot of the fall, were seen by thousands.
