It shall not be lawful for any person on the Lord's Day to run,

duct, or convey by any mode of conveyance any excursion on which passengers are conveyed for hire, having for its principle or only object the carriage on that day of such passengers for amusement or pleasure, and passengers so conveyed shall not be deemed to be travellers within the meaning of the act. It shall not be lawful for any per-

son on the Lord's Day to open to the public any park or pleasure ground or other place maintained for gain, directly or indirectly, or within which the raid said that if the police had a fee is charged for any service or waited until the afternoon they

It shall not be lawful for any person to advertise in any manner whatever any performance or other thing

The deposits of copper were enormous and Mr. Gamey had himself discovered and sold the mine at Copper Cliff, the best paying deposit in the country. In regard to iron one firm had opened a mine five years ago, and were shipping the ore away at the rate of one million tons a year. The iron mines in the United States were now showing signs of approaching exhaustion, and in a few years, he predicted capitalists would be developing these mines. . In conclusion, Mr. Gamey deplored the difficulty experienced in getting the government of the province to improve and develop that part of the country rapidly. It was providing a great revenue, and only a small part thereof was expended on its improvement

Votes of thanks were tendered to Mr. Gamey and all who took part in the program and the meeting closed by singing "God Save the King.
