

Edwards Kidney Tablets Presented With Gold Watches

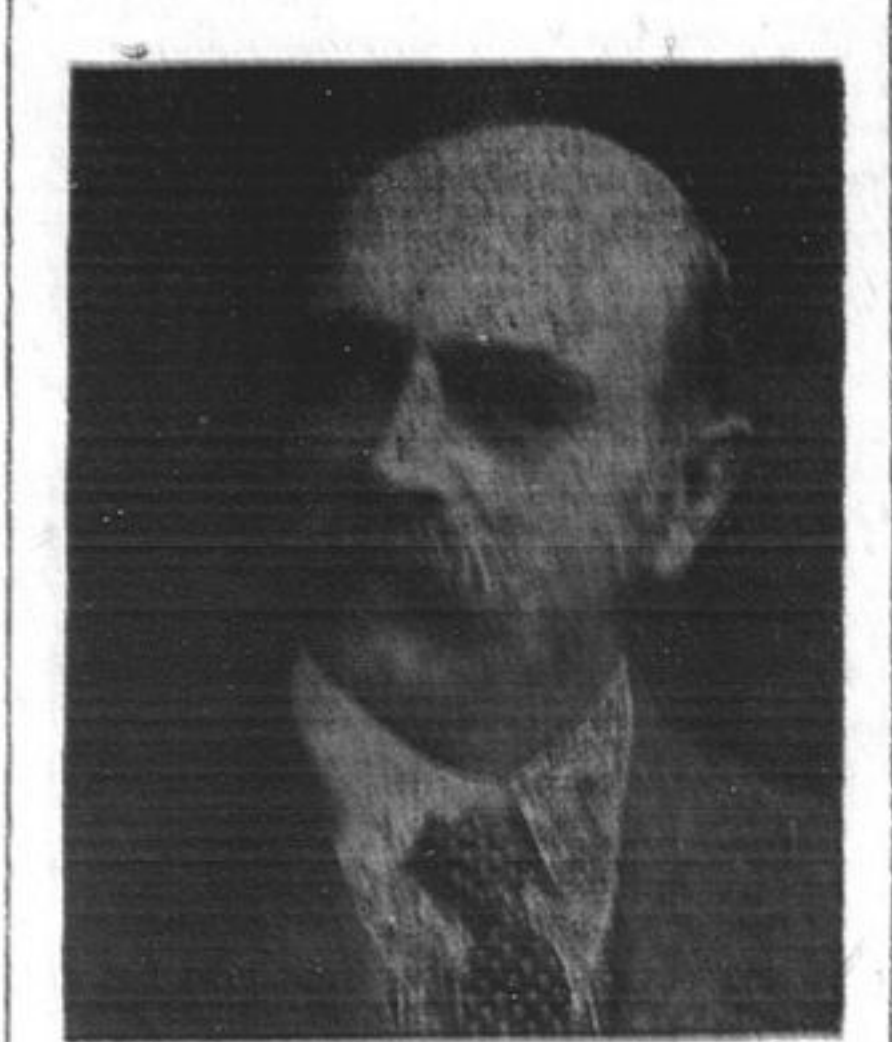

EULOGY OF A DOG

With a rabies scare in the Province, many champions of the dog are hastening to defend him from the unkind words of people who are naturally afraid of these animals. In the circumstances it is interesting to recall a eulogy of the dog which has been preserved as one of the most perfect things of its kind. It was delivered by Senator Vest when serving as attorney in the prosecution of a man who had wantonly shot a neighbor's dog.

"Gentlemen of the jury," he said, "the best friend a man has in this world may turn against him and become his enemy. His son or daughter that he has reared with loving care may become ungrateful. Those who are nearest and dearest to us, those whom we trust with our happiness and our good name may become traitors to their trust. The money that a man has he may lose. It flies away from him when he may need it most. A man's reputation may be sacrificed in a moment of ill-considered action. The people who are prone to fall on their knees and do us honor when success is with us may be the first to throw the stone of malice when failure settles its cloud upon our heads. The one that never deserts him, the one that never proves ungrateful or treacherous, is the dog. Gentlemen of the jury, a man's dog stands by him in prosperity and in poverty, in health and in sickness. He will sleep on the cold ground, where the wintry winds blow and snow drives fiercely, if only he may be near his master's side. He will kiss the hand that has no food to offer, he will lick the wounds and sores that come in encounters with the roughness of the world. He guards the sleep of his paper master as if he were a prince. When all other friends desert, he remains. When riches take wings and reputation falls to pieces, he is as constant in his love as the sun in its journey through the heavens. If fortune drives the master forth an outcast into the world, friendless and homeless, the faithful dog asks no higher privilege than that of accompanying him, to guard against danger, to fight against his enemies, and, when the last scene of all comes and death takes his master in its embrace, and his body is laid away in the cold ground, no matter if all other friends pursue their way, there by his graveside will the noble dog be found, his head between his paws, his eyes sad but open in alert watchfulness, faithful and true even to death."

The plaintiff had sued for \$200 damages. When Senator Vest finished speaking, the jury, after deliberating for two minutes, awarded \$500.

SLAPPED HIS FACE.

For slapping her son-in-law's face in the presence of 200 people at his Monday auction sale in Emily last Monday a well-known lady who resides near Downeyville was assessed \$10 and costs by County Magistrate Moore this morning. Berlin, Ont., Feb. 23.—Annie Fry, daughter of the late Jacob Fry, aged 20 years, committed suicide on Tuesday afternoon at her home, on the farm of Hy. Shantz, near Elmira. She tied a scarf to a bedpost and the other end around her neck, and strangled herself to death. She had been worrying for some time, having been accused of making certain statements, of which she claimed to be innocent.
