

Two years later, while addressing a meeting of the Y.M.C.A. at Lynn, Mass., Miss Crosby told the stary of the hymn. Afterwards, when shak. ing hands with the audience a young man came up and said: "I am the boy you prayed for that night. I found the Saviour and gave myself to Him, and since that time I have been trying to live a consistent Chris-
