

First Grant for Roads in Clay Belt.

The supplementary estimates contain an item of \$10,000 for colonization roads, the first grant ever asked for that district and the first sum asked for roads in what is known as "the great clay belt," which is the land in northern Ontario tri-ally to Hudson's Bay.

The intention in respect to the building of colonization roads in "the belt" is for the present to construct them so as to form trunk lines east and west from the Temiskaming & Northern Ontario Railway into the newly-surveyed townships.
